

# #1 ST. LUCIA HEADS FOR A BYE ELECTION IN THE CASTRIES CENTRAL CONSTITUENCY

January 25, 2006

#### ST. LUCIA HEADS FOR A BYE ELECTION IN THE CASTRIES CONSTITUENCY

Mrs. Sarah Flood-Beaubrun was a successful candidate in the Castries Constituency which is the Capital of Saint Lucia in the May, 1997 elections that brought the St. Lucia Labour Party to power and again in December, 2001. She resigned as a member of the Government and Cabinet in 2005 and remained in Parliament as an Independent member until January, 2006 when she resigned as a Member of Parliament and created an environment which necessitates a Bye Election within 90 days.

The Castries Constituency has been a hotly contested constituency ever since Dr. Vaughan Lewis took over candidacy and won the seat in a Bye Election in 1995 and was appointed Prime Minister. The Bye Election was brought about when Hon. George Mallet resigned as a Cabinet Minister in the United Workers Party (UWP) Government and became Governor General. Hon. George Mallet served as Minister of Trade and Industry prior to his appointment as Governor General, during which term he was knighted by Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth 2nd.

Unfortunately, Dr. Lewis' stint as Prime Minister was short lived when two years later in 1997 he lost to Miss. Sarah Flood who represented the St. Lucia Labour Party and became Minister of Health and a Member of the Cabinet of Ministers in the St. Lucia Labour Party Government, 1997-2001 during which time she got married. In the second term of the SLP Administration Hon. Sarah Flood Beaubrun served as Minister of Gender Relations.

For some weeks now the fate of Dr. Lewis was a secret in spite of rumours and speculations as to his political future. He was given a deadline by the Executive of the United Workers Party, a party which he led until Sir John Compton took over the reign of the party he led until passing on the Leadership to Dr. Lewis in 1995. Finally, Dr. Lewis spoke in time to meet his deadline and announced to the UWP and the Nation that he is not interested in contesting the upcoming Bye Election not the General Elections. He did not however in his letter declining the offer to run for the UWP, what is his position regarding his membership.

Both major political parties, the SLP and the UWP have not yet decided on their candidates but in the case of the former, a run off among 5 candidates is expected before the end of the month.

The Commissioner of elections has made the ruling that the current list of voters would be used in the Bye Elections while the new list would be used for the upcoming general elections expected in March, 2007. I will definitely not take that long. My prediction is that it will come in the last guarter of 2006.

### #2 ST. LUCIA CURRENTLY IN AN ELECTION MODE

February 11, 2006

ST. LUCIA CURRENTLY IN AN ELECTION MODE BUT IT IS BUSINESS AS USUAL!!!

St. Lucia is currently in an election mode, however somewhat low keyed since it would be firstly a Bye Election before the General Elections become due sometime before the end of March, 2007.

The St. Lucia Labour Party (S.L.P.) is heading for a Run Off on Sunday 12th February, 2006 among the following persons, Messrs Peter Lansiquot, Senator Victor Phillip La Corbiniere and Mrs. Petra Nelson. seeking to represent Central Castries in the Capital. There were five persons originally who showed interest to battle for the nomination but two have dropped out, namely, Peterson Francis and Claude Paul, former Comptroller of Customs. The United Workers Party (U.W.P.) is yet to name a candidate to contest the Bye Election and the National Development Movement (N.D.M.) is silent while Mrs. Sarah Flood-Beaubrun of Organization for National Empowerment (O.N.E.) is ahead of the pack being confident of if nothing else but that she will contest.

It is not smooth sailing at all for the major parties, the SLP is looking for two candidates for the General Elections in the constituencies of Micoud North where former SLP Senator Patrick Joseph is seeking to represent the constituency and Soufriere is vacant as Hon. Walter Francois has stated his intention not to contest the upcoming elections. The United Workers Party (U.W.P.) has been having to deal with Mrs. Sarah Flood-Beaubrun of O.N.E. and Mr. Ausbert D'Auvergne of N.D.M. in attempting to merge into one party without success to date. Had it not been promised by the incumbent party to go to the polls with a new voters' list, a snap election would have found most if not all of the parties in disarray. Fortunately, there are a few months to go before general elections could be called.

Unlike the pattern at election time in the More Developed Countries of CARICOM, where investments are put on hold, St. Lucia is moving ahead at great pace. It is very likely that given the state of political development in the country that the incumbent party will be returned. It is business as usual on island, the planned projects are coming on stream and even Air Jamaica (the Love Bird) returns to St. Lucia on February 23, 2006. Airlifts are improving, hotel rooms are increasing daily and Bed and Breakfast accommodation is moving apace.

A new and interesting development will emerge beyond Cricket World Cup 2007 with B&B accommodation when this new mode of accommodate will help to make St. Lucia a more affordable destination. There is a vital role for B&B in the accommodation sector and it creates a price balance in the offering.

In the meantime, the Government of St. Lucia has signaled its intention to move forward with the CARICOM Single Market (C.S.M.). Things are moving apace, there is no immediate evidence that the flood gates are opened and it is understandably so as the regulations to facilitate such movement is not quite in place. Although while the Government is moving ahead with the CARICOM Single Market (C.S.M.), many of the citizens are still skeptical about the prospects for real development. The effects will take some time to be felt but I am still convinced they can only be positive. My only concern is that it has come too late and I lament the fact that most of our trained people have exited to North America and Europe. While there is still sometime before the CARICOM Single Market (C.S.M.) comes into effect within the O.E.C.S., no effort should be spared to inform and educate the citizens about the challenges that face all citizens. The Development Fund is still struggling along and hopeful the support for the Fund will gain momentum. I am willing to predict that all those individuals and organizations that oppose or doubt the efficacy of this initiative will come to realize its benefits in due course.

Keep the Faith, God is in Charge!!!

# #3 POLITICAL CAMPAIGN HEATS UP IN ST. LUCIA - DR. VAUGHAN LEWIS JOINS SLP!!!

POLITICAL CAMPAIGN HEATS UP IN ST. LUCIA - DR. VAUGHAN LEWIS JOINS SLP!!!

The speculation is over. Dr. Vaughn Lewis, former Leader of the United Workers Party (UWP) and Prime Minister joined the St. Lucia Labour Party (SLP) boldly stating that things are better on the SLP side than on the UWP. Only time will tell but it seems he has earned the wrath of many. One thing is certain in St. Lucia is that elections will be free and fair and most important free from fear. So, in the end everyone would have been free to exercise their franchise or withhold it. That is the choice everyone makes. I believe that every citizen should utilize the right to vote or not to vote but the overriding fact remains that it is only by voting that you at least indicate the direction you wish your country to go. It is against this background that I am convinced that a serious BRING OUT THE VOTE campaign should be mounted.

Both major political parties have showed off their muscles with massive motorcades in recent weeks, SLP 12/9/06 and UWP16/9/06 and the trend will continue. The UWP Motorcade and Rally in Vieux Fort saw one of the biggest crowds assembled at a political Rally in St. Lucia. That is the constituency of Hon. Dr. Kenny D. Anthony, Leader of the SLP and current Prime Minister, and everyone is looking forward to the response from the SLP. However, the circumstances will be different as unlike the UWP which launched its opposing Candidate – Dr. Ulric Mondesir in the Vieux Fort South Constituency, the SLP will not be launching candidates when it holds its Rally in Vieux Fort as Dr. Anthony will be contesting the seat for the third consecutive time.

This is a very interesting period in the political development of St. Lucia as both major parties have brought on board several new faces, the SLP has done an almost complete remake with some very outstanding young men joining the ranks. The SLP is consistent in ensuring a strong presence of professional, community minded, youthful candidates while the UWP seems to be going after experience, in many instances bringing back into the equation experienced politicians.

What is at stake in this general election? Although things on the surface have never been better in St. Lucia there seems to be a state of restlessness and dissatisfaction, enough is not filtering down to the masses. However, the country is still in transition from an agricultural dependent economy to a services-based economy. Although TRANSITION is no longer a buzz word, it is very applicable in today's situation, as the process continues. Many farmers are now construction workers while many housewives are hotel workers. The UWP is hoping that the current level of dissatisfaction will create a ground swell of support that will catapult them to victory at the upcoming elections. In the final analysis, it all boils down to which party can be trusted to deliver on their campaign promises and ensure economic prosperity for the next five years.

The mood on the ground which echoes that of a vocally dissatisfied electorate cannot be taken for granted that it would be translated into a win for the UWP. There are some very interesting constituencies where some could be considered safe but it seems that a toss-up is possible in quite a few and as usual everybody's candidate is a winner until the ballots are counted. The next few weeks are going to be very interesting, especially when the date is announced for elections and the gates are opened and the race truly commences.

I cannot over emphasize the point that the candidates that are able to get out their voters will be the victors as it is very clear from the last poll in 2001, there were very low turnout in many constituencies, a situation which must be reversed if the electorate is to have a real say in the final results of the polls. The same could be said of the Central Castries Bye – Elections in 2006. Voter apathy should be worked on, so as to get the electorate to vote. So, it is very important that the actors in civil society get to work in all earnest to bring out the vote.

During my stint in the Guyana elections, I was told that the party with the most money and dominance in advertising wins the elections. It was true in Guyana, could the same scenario play out in the St. Lucia elections? Only time will tell, stay tuned.

Remember always, God is in charge, just keep the Faith!!!

Maybe at the end, this could also be the most expensive of campaigns to be mounted in St. Lucia. The launching of candidates is intensifying as the announcement of election date looms. An early December date could well be on the cards. On the last occasion it was the 3rd of December, 2001.

It is interesting to note that while there is a hive of political activity in the country, it is still business as usual due to the heavy demands placed upon the private sector, not only to provide accommodation but also goods and services. Everyone is racing against the clock to be ready to deliver on the promise of the region's leaders to make CWC 2007 the best Cricket World Cup ever. It is truly an exciting period to be in St. Lucia and I would like to encourage St. Lucians and friends of St. Lucia to visit the week of elections and experience democracy in action. Democracy's principal objective should be to deliver a Government that reflects the will of the people – every time.

The build up to Elections in the Caribbean is all about supporters having great fun and traveling into the various areas of the country meeting old friends and sharing their views on how the campaign is headed and who should be a candidate and who shouldn't. But the interesting part is when two persons on opposing sides meet to discuss the politics of the day. Some claim that it is too close to call and some claim it will be 12-5 but when it is declared in favour of the SLP, the opposing side claims that it will be in the reverse.

Bro. George Odlum used to say, you have to keep your ears to the ground. I try to keep my ears to the ground and it is amazing how some people have declared the winning party already. Many people genuinely feel that the United Workers Party (UWP) could win this election but the incumbent is confident of a victory for a third term. The incumbent St. Lucia Labour Party (SLP) has a formidable team of young professionals. Agriculture is at the heart of the debate and it should be noted that it is on the front burner of the only Independent Candidate – Mr. Patrick H. Joseph's campaign. If agriculture is to be given any prominence or put another way, if the electorate buy into the proposition that Agriculture is still a viable sector, the UWP has credible candidates who are directly involved in Agriculture to make their case. But if on the other hand, the electorate buys into the gains of the tourism sector in recent years and that agriculture is on a downward slide, then the SLP is well ahead.

Looking at the constituencies, the toss ups seem to be between Dr. Vaughan Lewis – SLP and Hon. Richard Frederick – UWP for the Castries Central seat and His Excellency Julian R. Hunte – SLP and Senator Leonard Montoute – UWP for Gros Islet. There are seventeen constituencies. The SLP has won the last two elections, 1997 when they came into office with a 16-1 majority and in 2001with a 14-3 majority. A win for the UWP will demand a minimum of 6 additional seats.

It is also interesting to note that Hon. Damian Greaves has moved from Dennery South to Dennery North leaving behind what is considered a safe seat to do battle with Hon. Marcus Nicholas who currently holds the seat and is the Leader of the Opposition in Parliament.

The battle for the hearts and minds of St. Lucians though it has already begun, will be fast forwarded upon the announcement of the Election Date. The final furlong will be fast, especially in the closing moments as they head to the polls. Whatever the combination, the forecast must be accurate with a WIN ONLY bet.

Until the winner is at the finishing line when all the ballots are counted and duly declared anyone who ventures to suggest a winner will have to be given a word from the Lord.

ICT is a very attractive area, especially as Data is moved over the Internet which has opened up a number of possibilities. Health Insurance Companies are not only looking for Sheltered and other Medical Care from less costly destinations, they are seeking other related data services. Call Centres, Legal, Architectural, Engineering and many other services can be offered from anywhere in the world. Human Resource services are very much in demand. While India is especially attractive for offshore contracts, there is a problem of distance, hence the need for near-shore operations and that is where destinations like St. Lucia have an advantage.

The next few days are going to be very interesting as the Cabinet emerges and the movers and shakers get down to business.

Let us get to work - young and old, put our differences aside and get St. Lucia moving.

There are several business models available in the world today and creative minds are constantly at work to implement others. A lot of emphasis is being placed on changing from a cash economy to a non cash means of financial settlements.

Today, we find major businesses getting involved in barter exchange. We hear about alternative currency which is being promoted by major corporations, visit www.creditz.com and see what Fortune 500 companies are doing in collaboration with Creditz Digital Currency System in transforming reward points, frequent flyer miles, loyalty points and other non-cash currencies into a digital currency, which will be used as cash at participating national retailers, merchants, vendors and manufacturers. It is time for businesspersons, especially those who travel frequently to consider establishing a USA address so that participation would be possible in several of the programmes being offered in the developed world.

Even Donald Trump leverages his name and expertise in projects. It is amazing what investing your time and expertise in fledgling business could yield. Too many of us are caught up with the "money now" syndrome. Depending upon your contribution, though its non-cash, you can demand reasonably as much as thirty-three (33) percent stake in a company. In the consulting business I learned very early not to think short term, but think long term, based on the performance of your recommendations. I know this method works.

There is a continuing trend in North America, where small businesses are consolidating. While there are the big business mergers taking place, quietly there is a parallel development where creative entrepreneurs are rolling up dozens of small companies into larger entities to provide greater efficiencies and wield marketing power. The results of such initiatives could only bring about sustainable and viable outcomes. I made this point a few years ago when in my capacity as President of the Association of Eastern Caribbean Exporters (AECE), I supported the merits of Article 56 regarding industry allocation and drew attention to the Pasta industry where there are so many plants in the region, when one in the Leeward and one in the Windward would have sufficed. It is time for businesspersons to come together and rationalize the state of their businesses and be prepared to adapt to the changing business and social environment.

It has been some time now since I have been laboring the point that Barter as means of settling payments, exchanging services and expanding sales is a system that needs to be revisited. Barter is considered the greatest all-time method of trading.

Here is an idea for a private sector association to co-ordinate a unique programme and earn revenue by promoting coupons that are printable by customers. Visit www.coccoupons.com This is yet another system that helps promote a cashless market place. It is happening too often that simple projects are left to others to introduce to our shores. The most recent is Cariblist, a real estate project, an internet driven business that is a big success. You can visit their site at www.cariblist.com This proves the point that if we don't do it for ourselves, someone else will and that is what CSM is all about.

An interesting thought came to my mind as I was writing this article and it could be a starting point. There are several businesses that have the potential to go regional. If a private sector association could get a consultant to establish the companies in the various islands and provide the business owners with a manual as to how they should approach their particular business and also arrange advertisements to promote the interests of the companies in the region.

I am very passionate about giving back. The time to look for opportunities to help others in life and in business is now! Those persons who have the desire to be change agents in a world that cries out for such persons could Volunteer and offer their time and skills in a structured manner. It would be interesting to see how this group advances beyond CWC 2007. Both parties have to date endorsed fourteen (14) candidates each out of the possible seventeen (17) constituencies on the island. The SLP is yet to name candidates in Dennery North, Dennery South and Babonneau constituencies and the UWP in Micoud North, Castries South and Dennery South. Rumor has it that there could be changes of endorsed candidates along the way in at least one of the parties. The million-dollar question is – when will be elections in St. Lucia. There is no sign of urgency coming from the SLP camp to indicate a possible election date before December, 2006 but constitutionally, the government has until March 2007 to call general elections.

What is the state of play? While the UWP is failing to take advantage of the new kid on the block Mr. Richard Frederick, a prominent attorney at law who successfully contested the Central Castries seat recently, the SLP is positioning itself to be a formidable contestant in the next general elections whenever that day comes. The recent endorsement of His Excellency Julian R. Hunte who is the current Ambassador to the United Nations is one such move in the process of producing viable candidates to the electorate.

As I move around the country and discuss the present status of the political parties as they get set to parade in preparation to enter the starting gates, I ask the question which party do you think will win the next general elections? Those who want to play it safe will respond that it is too close to call. I say it is not too close to call.

Edward Harris is back!

After an absence of two months from St. Lucia, I am back and am very pleased to update my readers on my mission to Guyana where I was a part of the Alliance For Change – 2006 Elections Campaign Team.

In 1997 when I managed the Guyana Democratic Party (GDP) Asgar Ali Campaign, the circumstances and the results were very different to my recent assignment when I was a part of the Campaign Management Team in the capacity of Campaign Operations Manager for the Alliance For Change. When I returned to St. Lucia in December of 1997, I announced to my friends that I was cheated but not defeated. We were white washed. The ensuing months told the story. Although voters were given photo IDs that did not guarantee fair elections. This time however, things were very different and the checks and balances were in place theoretically but varied somewhat in application. In spite of the problems that arose on Election Day, the observers were loud in their praises for GECOM and the Guyanese people who were finally able to participate in an election free of violent incidents. It must be noted that no observer team could have covered all the polling stations across the country. Sir John Compton, former Prime Minister of Saint Lucia led the Commonwealth Observer Team to Guyana for the 2006 General Elections.

The AFC in just nine months of its existence decided to participate in the 2006 General Elections of Guyana with less than one month to campaign. For the first time in the history of Guyana, a new political party caused the two major parties, the People's Progressive Party / Civic (PPP/C) and the People's National Congress / Reform - One Guyana (PNC/R) so much concern. The AFC's principal objective to hold the balance of power was almost certain when in the final days of the campaign, the PPP/C and the PNC/R - One Guyana unleashed their artillery to demolish the gains of the AFC, when apart from subtle threats to their former supporters and intensifying their house to house campaign preaching to the people that the AFC will split the vote and more importantly the PPP/C was telling their supporters that a vote for the AFC is a vote for the PNC/R which was keeping a line that their supporters must not split the vote. It all boiled down to a return to racial voting. The East Indians voted for the PPP/C and the Blacks for the PNC/R. The racial overtones got so bad that the PPP/C was requested by the Media Monitoring Committee to withdraw their "great pretender advert" which highlighted the burning down of certain parts of Georgetown and aligning Mr. Raphael Trotman, AFC Presidential Candidate with that state of affairs as it was alleged that while he was a part of the PNC/R it was their supporters that were involved in the hooliganism that resulted. That was very unfair and if there was one chilling effect, it was that advert and the Indian population reverted to their safety net in the protective arms of the PPP/C.

In spite of the many negatives of the campaign and the elections, unlike what you might have heard and in some cases believe, the rumors about Election Day activities paint a different picture. Let the officials of GECOM explain why the presiding officers locked out Polling Agents from polling places demanding letters certifying their appointment in spite they had identification cards which were provided by GECOM? Let them further explain why Region 10 results were declared without all the statements of poll being reported? After the morning fiasco the said situation developed at the close of poll with the counting agents, they were again asked for letters and this was not an isolated matter, it happened across the country.

I have a personal problem with the votes being tabulated by computers. I believe that is too advanced for Guyana unless the entire process was electronically processed and removed the input of individuals. There were over 1,900 polling stations across the country and again that presented a logistical nightmare to find supporters to man all the stations. The maximum number of voters listed at anyone polling station did not exceed 450 which could have been substantially greater and thus reducing the amount of polling stations required. GECOM as we knew it is no more, yet another important building and its contents were lost to a fire that took it all. What will ever happen to the uncounted boxes from Region 10?

In the end, the supporters of the AFC romped home with 5 seats in the house of parliament and 21 seats in Regional Democratic Councils across the country. In one instance it achieved its goal of being the balance of power which was achieved with 3 seats in the Regional Democratic Council in Region 4.

The final count of parliamentary seats is PPP/C 36, PNC/R-One Guyana 22, AFC 5, GAP/ROAR 1 and TUF 1. Looking toward the future there is an urgent need for Municipal and Local Government Elections but given the loss of GECOM's headquarters, this may not be possible for some months.

I continue to take care of my broken leg and hope to be out of the cast within a few days so that I can move around to catch up on the St. Lucia election campaign. Only if the political conditions could be in Guyana as there are here in St. Lucia – what a country it would be? I pray that St. Lucians will cherish their democratic freedoms and exercise their vote on Elections' Day.

WILL VISAS REQUIREMENT AFFECT VISITOR ARRIVALS FOR CRICKET WORLD CUP 2007?

Dr. Basil Springer writing in the Barbados Advocate Business Monday, dateline 8/1/07 was very critical about the impact of the Visa requirement for visitors from certain countries seeking to attend the ICC CWC 2007 games and he noted: "I recall that one of the major arguments used in defending the large expenditure by Caribbean Governments in mounting ICC CWC 2007 was the "legacy" benefit. There would be significant TV exposure during the 51 matches, following the 16 warm-up matches, and this would provide a major promotional foundation on which to sell the Caribbean in the future and enhance the tourism arrivals to the Caribbean in a sustained manner. Unfortunately, before the matches have begun there has been instant (information age) world-wide negative publicity which has not subsided since the release that "visitors to the Caribbean from a number of countries participating in the World Cup – in particular India, Pakistan, Australia and New Zealand – will need to obtain a new US\$100 visa".

There are 10 CARICOM States that have placed this restriction and 9 will actually host matches. In recent days our hoteliers are complaining about cancellations and the international tour operators are diverting tourists to Scandinavian countries. Visit http://www.caricomimpacs.org to check on countries that are exempted from the CARICOM Special Visa Requirement which comes into effect on February 1 and continues to May 15, 2007.

I looked at the matches schedule and discovered that 6 Group matches and 1 Semi-Final will be played in St. Lucia between the period March 13-25 and on April 25, 2007. You can view the schedule of matches at http://www.cricketworldcup.com By now anyone with interest in ICC CWC 2007 would have heard about the number of matches to be played in St. Lucia, but I am not sure that not everyone has taken a quiet moment to evaluate what would be the likely outcome of the events. We have heard about the world-wide visibility and the legacy that will redound to the hosting nations beyond the overall event. We are expected to be on our best behaviour and to deliver services beyond expectation beginning with easy access to the host countries. I am certain that those charged with the responsibilities to ensure the security of all persons attending the matches must have had good reasons for the decisions that they arrived at in this regard, though it is unfortunate that the Visa issue had to be an integral part. The decision has been taken and we will have to live with it.

Looking on the brighter side, we must be proud of the consistent rating that St. Lucia has been receiving at every stage as we continue to prepare for the event. I believe as the opening date approaches, everything will be in place and we would all say "Let the matches begin!" This is our moment to shine and shine we will!

There are a few developments taking place in St. Lucia that are worthy of note. The St. Lucia Tourist Board is wooing visitors to St. Lucia with its Super Summer Savings promotion during the Summer months, ending November 30, 2007. This is a very good effort and should earn the island substantial goodwill as satisfied visitors spread the word to family and friends.

The past few weeks have seen a number of Conferences being hosted in St. Lucia. For a moment I was beginning to think that the high airfares are deterring organizers from using St. Lucia as their destination of choice.

A number of articles have been written on the subject of increased fares without any indication of a reduction in sight. I am not one to give up easily on worrying issues and I feel that if Liat, Star of the Caribbean Airline was established to serve the citizens of the sub region then it cannot do what it pleases in spite of the cries of the people. The fares are definitely affecting businesses and individuals who need to travel around the region. Can we see some relief in the Summer? I firmly believe that something will have to be done.

It is not easy to invite competition in the airline industry as recent attempts in the region were not successful. The memories of Carib Star, Helen Air and EC Express are all fresh in our minds. The question is: are the fares currently charged by our Airline realistic or is there some kind of price gouging going on? There must be some answers to our questions or are the Directors oblivious to the problems of their customers? Why are the simple things so difficult to be solved? There is always talk about foreign monopoly but when our own monopoly acts so harshly with its own, who do we appeal to? It is said the voice of the people is the voice of God, so I expect to be treated fairly or Miracles will have to be performed.

There is talk about the introduction of high-speed boats to challenge the cost of air transportation. However, this is not the first time I heard about such a project. But the current ferry services operated to Martinique and Dominica from St. Lucia does prove that such a service is viable at least in area that it currently operates. The recent promotional blitz of Wave Riders with Bill Boards of all sizes around the island offering passenger trips to Martinique is an indication of the possibilities of sea transportation.

Do we wait to see if Liat, Star of the Caribbean Airline will launch a Summer promotion in the first instance and then seriously look into the possibility of restructuring their airfares in the future to be affordable to the traveling public? Or do we invite competition from another airline? It is only fair that our Governments seek to ascertain whether the airfares charged by Caribbean Airline are fair. If the fares are fair, a decision will have to be taken as to how we deal with declining travel in the region which seriously affects our tourist arrivals and reduces St. Lucia's favourable position as a preferred conference destination.

In situations like these when things are not what they should be in spite they can be what we expect them to be, there is only one thing to do is to enjoy the party. It is Carnival time and the season has just begun so I am off to the tents. The Ambassador Tent is celebrating 25 years in the business. Their season opened Wednesday last and it was great, the old and young boys shone in their glory. Youth and experience is still a combination to beat. ## #22 ST. LUCIA INDUSTRIAL & SMALL BUSINESS ASSOCIATION (SLISBA) THE PAST, THE PRESENT AND THE FUTURE!!!

ST. LUCIA INDUSTRIAL & SMALL BUSINESS ASSOCIATION (SLISBA) THE PAST, THE PRESENT AND THE FUTURE!!!

Twenty-five continuous years in the life of any organization is commendable. SLISBA celebrates twenty-five years of service to the business community in St. Lucia. In recognition of this significant milestone the Directors of SLISBA designated the month of August, 2007 as "SMALL BUSINESS MONTH". This initiative was endorsed by the Ministry of Trade, Industry & Commerce and Senator, Hon. Guy Mayers officially launched the month of activities at a simple ceremony held at the Auberge Seraphine, Pt. Seraphine on Thursday, July 26, 2007.

#### The beginning – Looking back:

It is said that those who fail to remember the past are condemned to repeat it. I believe that the past instructs the future. It is against this background that I seek to draw to the attention of my readers, the struggles of SLISBA over the years. Looking at the business landscape 25 years ago when there was no representation of small businesses on the island, a group of small businesspersons got together and formed the Small Business Association in 1982. Mr. Steve Annius became its first President. Just around the same time operators in the fledging manufacturing sector organized representation through the St. Lucia Manufacturers Association under the leadership of Mr. Leo Clarke.

#### The Merger:

The two organizations struggled along for the first seven years at which point a strategic decision was taken to merge the two organizations and present a uniformed platform to represent small businesses in St. Lucia. The new organization was named St. Lucia Industrial & Small Business Association with the acronym SLISBA. The office was located in the Monplaisir Building on Brazil Street, Castries. Earlier Executive Directors include Ms. Claudia Jn Baptiste and Dr. Urban Seraphin.

#### The high and low periods of the Association:

As financial fortunes changed over time and the level of assistance varied, the Association delivery of service to its members was curtailed. The Association moved office several times. Sometimes members assisted by maintaining the office, meeting all expenses, others housed the association within their businesses but the core objective of the Association – ADVOCACY which continues up to this day was always maintained.

The withdrawal of USAID support from the Eastern Caribbean greatly affected the operations of SLISBA until 2005 when the Government granted the Association a subvention of one hundred thousand EC dollars (EC\$100,000.00). This support was repeated in 2006.

Mr. Steve Annius recalled at the launching of Small Business Month, the enviable position SLISBA held as a private sector Association. Most Representatives from international agencies who visited St. Lucia called at the Secretariat to be briefed on developments in the small business sector. During the past twelve years there were a few companies that stood out in their support to the Association, namely: Roserie Group of Companies, Unique Printers and Speed Printing Services. The Managing Director of Speed Printing Services is a current member of SLISBA's Board of Directors.

One thing that stands out over the years is the will of small businesspersons to maintain the presence of SLISBA. SLISBA has always maintained a presence and have been there for the business community in general. The records will attest to that fact. Members will come and go and return but two members have kept the faith over the years and have been active from the inception of SLISBA. They are Priestley Louison and Tedburt Theobalds who are members of the current Board of Directors. The longest affiliated member in the manufacturing sector is Mr. Peter Charles whose membership dates back to the merger.

SLISBA's membership at its peak was in excess of 150. It has been noted that when there are challenges to the operations of business, membership is at its highest but when things are quiet, interest tends to be low. However, SLISBA has always been the fire engine ready to respond to fires whenever called upon.

#### SLISBA - A VITAL ENTITY IN PRIVATE SECTOR ADVOCACY:

SLISBA has continued over the years whenever called upon to participate fully in all initiatives promoted by the government and those in collaboration between the Government and international/regional agencies.

It was SLISBA, given its strong base of members in the manufacturing sector that moved to get Hon. Walter Francois, the then Minister of Commerce to resist Dominica's position to do away with Article 56 and as a result the regime was extended for several years thereafter. The Chamber was fully supportive of the initiative.

SLISBA used its membership base of manufacturers to push for a St. Lucia Manufacturers Association as it was felt that the time had come for Manufacturers to stand on their own once again. The SMA made substantial gains in recent years and their members have benefited from many interventions and concessions by the Government. Many Manufacturers still maintain their membership in SLISBA.

Directors and members of SLISBA have served and chaired numerous Boards over the years and have contributed substantially to the economic development of the country.

Through the support of SLISBA many small businesses have grown substantially.

Apart from the Advocacy, SLISBA has always offered a platform for networking among its members.

#### The Present Term 2005-2007:

SLISBA under the leadership of the current Board of Directors headed by Mr. Patrick H. Joseph since 2003 has overcome many challenges. After suffering a number of setbacks in acquiring office space, including after equipping an office offered by FICS at no cost to the Association for 2 years, the building was completely destroyed by fire. Finally, in 2005 a Secretariat was established in the American Drywall Building, Vide Boutielle, Castries. The current Board of Directors comprises of the following persons:

THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS – 2005/2007, Patrick H. Joseph – President, Hilton Jn. Baptiste – 1st Vice President, John Honora – 2nd Vice President, Callista Mc. Lawrence – Secretary, Priestley Louison – Treasurer, Vincent Doxerie – Member, Tedburt Theobalds – Member, Eldridge Stephens – Member.

Since the establishment of the Secretariat with a subvention from Government, a number of positive developments have occurred, namely:

a) SLISBA became a founding member of the Caribbean Association of Small & Medium Enterprises (CASME) based in Barbados. This is the umbrella organization of Small Business Associations in the region and is headquartered in Barbados. The current President is Senator Sandra Husbands and the Executive Director is Ms. Lynette Holder.

The Small Business Association of Barbados and CASME continue to share their experiences with SLISBA and have met with Government Officials in the Ministry of Commerce.

- b) Through CASME's support SLISBA received assistance from Caribbean Export Development Agency (CEDA) for a Strategic Plan which was implemented in the first quarter of 2007.
- c) The paid up Membership of the Association is at its highest in recent years. Quarterly Meetings for 2007 were held in Castries and Vieux Fort.
- d) Relationships are being forged with Embassies, Regional and International Agencies and support is continuing from OPSR.
- e) The Association has a new website which was funded by OPSR. Visit http://www.slisbastlucia.com
- f) Advocacy and Networking continue to be the main platform of the Association.
- g) With the support of VIP Consultants, SLISBA members participated in a Trade and Cultural Exhibition in Cayenne in 2006. A MOU was signed by the Mayor of Matoury and the President of SLISBA.
- h) Mr. Edward Harris, former Secretary and President of SLISBA was recruited as Management Consultant in February, 2007.

#### The future:

The activities planned for the month of August – 2007 will expose the work of SLISBA to the nation. The 18th Annual General Meeting of the Association will be held on the 19th of August, 2007 and a new Board of Directors will be elected.

- b) Relationship with SEDU and OPSR will be strengthened.
- c) SLISBA's services to its membership will be substantially improved in the months ahead.
- d) Training will be undertaken to equip members in the use of Computer programmes and the Internet.
- e) Overseas trips to Trade Exhibitions and participation in Trade Fairs will be encouraged.
- f) SLISBA will continue to actively participate in the Private Sector Council of St. Lucia.

#### ANOTHER STANDARD IS COMING!

I had the opportunity to attend a Regional Seminar held in Trinidad, September 10-12, 2007on the theme "Promoting Social Responsibility in Small and Medium Sized Businesses in the Caribbean". The Seminar was organized by the Organization of American States (OAS), Young Americas Business Trust (YATB), the Executive Secretariat for Integral Development of the Organization of American States (SEDI/OAS) with the support of Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA) in cooperation with the United Nations Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean UN-ECLAC and the Caribbean Association of Industry and Commerce (CAIC). The importance of the Seminar could be noted from the organizations that supported the initiative.

On the second day of the Seminar, the Secretary General Jose Miguel Insulza of the OAS addressed participants. He drew attention to poverty and crime and lamented on the ills of society. He noted that one out of every four young persons in Latin America and the Caribbean not going to school or not working. Young people between the ages of 15 – 29 who went overseas at tender ages and become first time offenders are being deported back to the countries of their birth for simple misdemeanors after being incarcerated with hardened criminals. The UN and the OAS are committed to CSR.

St. Lucia was represented by five persons drawn from the private and public sectors. Other participants were drawn from Guyana, Trinidad, Barbados and Jamaica. There were some concerns by participants as to why the Seminar targeted Small and Medium Enterprises but two positions were advanced. 1. That large businesses are already practicing CSR and 2. That SMEs are the largest group of employers, employing over 60 percent of the work force.

It was noted that CSR gives businesses a social conscience and improves corporate image. Generally, CSR when effectively applied will make a significant difference to the bottom line. CSR is seen as one standard that every business can apply some aspect of it to its core business.

It is recommended that Businesspersons begin the process of learning and applying CSR by visiting http://www.compact.org and become a part of this transforming standard that promotes giving back to your community. Businesses can change the world while increasing their bottom line with the effective application of CSR. A regional seminar will be held in Barbados in November as the process of informing and training persons that are committed to the life changing effects of CSR so that they can become ambassadors to spread the CSR doctrine.

The standard is about Corporate Social Responsibility (CRS) and will be available to the business sector within months. It will be guided by ISO 26000 which comes into effect by 2009. What is CSR? A definition provided by the promoters is "Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) is a business approach that views respect for ethics, people, communities and the environment, as an integral strategy that increases value added and thus improves the competitive position of a firm".

Already some large and small companies are practicing some form of CSR especially in the area of philanthropy. Until now there is no measurement of what benefits are being derived from the ad hoc philanthropic support that is given to communities in the region. CSR as a standard will measure the impact of all aspects of Corporate Social Responsible endeavors.

This is one standard that seems to be a natural. You will discover that many of the areas of activity you identify to undertake you should have been doing them a long time ago. The shocker is you would have been so much more advanced in your business. Remember it is in giving that you receive and the interesting part is that in many instances, organization/effective management takes the place of money. I am committed to pursuing CSR and ask that you join the St. Lucia CSR team as they collaborate with the St. Lucia Bureau of Standards to introduce CSR to businesses in St. Lucia.

However, as soon as the results were known I received a phone call which revealed that supporters of the UWP closed ranks to deliver the constituency to their Candidate who was chosen at the run off. The SLP failed to prove its point that the Government was not living up to expectations. A win for the SLP would have confirmed that position. Most important she had to learn to deal with the ordinary people including fishermen. It is not simply a desk job; it carries risk as the need arises from time to time to brave the waters of the sea and investigate what is happening to the various species of fishes and mammals under the sea. The first time I met her was at a Whaling Conference and she was very confident in her contributions.

A loss for the UWP would have shaken the UWP and invite all kinds of speculations but once again it was not to be. By – Elections in UWP strongholds have not favored the SLP and they will have to rethink their strategy. Once again, it might have been better to sit out the election and continue to carry on their campaign of being the voice of the Opposition.

That's enough for politics, life goes on and it is important to note that Tourism is doing well. There haven't been so many cruise ships in our harbours for a long time. While I don't have the figures, I feel that given the size of the vessels, a record number of cruise passengers will grace our shores. The taxi drivers are in for a great season. Senator, Hon. The negative publicity that plagued the administration in the early months have subsided and it is now for the parliamentarians on the government side to do what they were elected to do. It would be interesting to read the Prime Minister's report to the nation on the first year of the UWP administration in office. The year 2008 holds great promise for St. Lucia and it is time for all parliamentarians to come together and work for the good of the country.

The only way to make life comfortable for the working class is to attract investments into the country that will create jobs. At least two persons in every household with persons of working age should be working. At the rate cost of living is rising, the emphasis will have to move from increased wages to additional jobs being made available. Persons in the lower-and middle-income brackets will have to begin to do at home what they do in the USA and Canada, and work at two or more jobs. A few days ago, I got a call from a young lady who lives in the USA and in our discussion, she mentioned that she has five jobs. I am still working out in my mind if she has to report daily to places of work, how many hours per day, how many days per week, etc... I was speechless when I heard the number of jobs she has.

St. Lucia is now ready to take the step to the next level where we will have to move away from the old ways of doing things and take decisions to modernize the country, especially the City of Castries. Shopping must be extended to 6.00pm and businesses must be opened on weekends.

The Diaspora must find ways of getting involved in the development at home. I have alluded to this in previous articles and I will dedicate my next article to how the Diaspora can contribute.

# #28 LIAT MUST NOT BE ALLOWED TO RETARD THE ECONOMIC PROGRESS ACHIEVED IN THE REGION

LIAT MUST NOT BE ALLOWED TO RETARD THE ECONOMIC PROGRESS ACHIEVED IN THE REGION

LIAT is taking CARICOM Nationals and by extension their business associates and friends from outside of the region for granted. Already the high fares have slowed down travel. To add insult to injury, the irregular schedules and down times are causing serious problems in scheduling business and other meetings. What is even more disgusting is the fact that to be sure of getting to a destination for an important meeting, it might be necessary to get there days in advance and not knowing for sure when you will get back to your base. This will definitely increase cost. Already we have increased airfares, now we have additional accommodation and other expenses. The decision has already been taken by many that they will only travel if they must, in cases of last resort. Already I am beginning to hear about telephone and video conferencing. If the latter innovation is taken seriously LIAT could be in serious problems and hotels will suffer. Business travel is a vital contributor to the tourism sector. It cannot be over emphasized that LIAT's operation is vital to the survival to businesses as a whole in the region.

The management of LIAT has already sent out a signal that the season will be turbulent in relation to their operations. What a time for such an announcement. This is the peak season for tourism. Something must be done without any further delay. A month ago, an associate of mine was going to Toronto to see his family and after heading to the airport to make a connection in Barbados, the flight never operated, he had to return the following day. My own experience last Sunday was very frustrating. As usual I was instructed to get to the airport two hours before the flight and recognizing the unpredictability of LIAT, I arrived ninety minutes before the departure time. The monitor in the departure lounge does not keep up with the changes and prefers to maintain on time update regardless. However, after an announcement that the flight was delayed, we soon discovered that that flight was cancelled. We were booked on another flight which was expected to pick up the passengers in about two hours. When that flight landed and parked in its ramp position, it was discovered that there was a problem with the radar and the flight had to be grounded. Approximately seven hours after my arrival at the airport, I was finally put on a plane which was diverted from Antigua. However only about 50% of the passengers were lucky to get on the flight. The others had to overnight in St. Lucia. I hope they were able to get on a flight the following day.

While I was having my own problems in getting to Barbados, other persons headed to the conference were having their own. The Trinidad participants had to overnight in St. Vincent and the flight that the Guyanese were on, had to turn back to Guyana after almost 50% of the journey. They had to overnight and were fortunate to get to the conference after the opening ceremony. I must admit that I am getting a bit concerned about the safety of passengers. LIAT must do better. What about leasing a few aircrafts to operate the routes until the situation could be brought under control?

I decided to spend an additional day in Barbados after the conference to meet with the management of the Barbados Small Business Association. After visiting one of the Branches in the company of the Field Officer, we went to the head office where we picked up the Financial Controller who joined us for lunch. The two ladies were gracious and they took me to the Hilton where I was treated to a sumptuous Buffet Lunch. We were having a great time when suddenly I began to feel a movement under me as if I was riding a wave. We looked at each other in amazement and I concluded it was an earthquake. My experiences with similar situations in the past were that they were swift. This time it was prolonged and it looked like the end of the world was at hand.

Upon entering the Hilton which is a multi-storied building, I enquired from one of the workers as to the amount of rooms. She said it was about 350. As I walk to the dining area, I looked at the massive structure and debated in my mind about the possibility of a fire or disaster and concluded that I would not like to stay in room that is not close to the ground floor. I was thinking about evacuation. However, a few minutes to three o'clock disaster struck the Caribbean with a massive earthquake first reported at 7.3 magnitude. I estimated the magnitude of the earthquake to be over 7 and I was correct. It was definitely a frightening experience for many persons of which I am one. We went back to the office to share experiences about the dreadful moment. One of the ladies had a napkin on her chest when we dashed out of the building. We placed our signature on it and she promised to keep it in memory of the day that Barbadians got an end of the world experience.

A number of short comings were noted. There is no evacuation plan for exiting Bridgetown, I took too long. #### AGRICULTURE ON THE FRONT BURNER!!!

The importance of Agriculture in the economy is gaining serious attention as the agencies concerned with the development of Agriculture take steps to put the sector on the front burner. The importance of Agriculture cannot be over emphasized. Even if the Banana Industry is in the twilight stage, there is still a role for farmers to diversify production to ensure food safety. With the impact of global warming and all the pitfalls of the environment, food supply must nevertheless be maintained.

Last week I had the pleasure of sitting in on a 4-day workshop which sought to promote Entrepreneurship in Agriculture. This week I was exposed to the implications of the Economic Partnership Agreement as they relate to the Agriculture Sector. Dr. Claudius Preville led the discussions and pointed to areas of concern and opportunities as a result of the EPA. Since what is done is done and it will take protracted negotiations to undo some of the grey areas in the agreement, I would rather deal with the challenges and opportunities.

The principal challenge is to keep the citizens of the region informed about the EPA and how they can access the various measures that have been put in place to facilitate the development aspect of the agreement. The European negotiators have been able to achieve in three years what the regional grouping has been unable to achieve in thirty-five years. That significant agreement is to gain trade access to the Bahamas market when the Agreement comes into effect. It is my feeling that CARICOM Prime Ministers have a window of opportunity to request that the trade aspect of CARICOM be expanded to afford fellow CARICOM countries duty free trading access into the Bahamas market. It is time that the Bahamas yield to its CARICOM partners.

Entrepreneurs in the region must begin to forge business relationships with their counterparts in the Bahamas and the Dominican Republic not when the agreement comes into effect but now. Joint ventures in the manufacturing and services sectors must be vigorously pursued. In penetrating the two markets, emphasis should be placed on setting up satellite plants wherever practicable instead of trying to export finished products. Frootsy Foods and Baron Foods are two local companies that should be able to establish a presence through joint venture to penetrate the two markets.

The price of oil has now risen to US\$111.00. This development has serious implications for cost of doing business and the cost of living. The US dollar at the said time is declining. Americans are feeling the heat financially. Our tourism industry has serious challenges. There is no need to panic. Rather, we must seek to find ways to cushion the effects. Restraint is very important. Opportunities to conserve and effect savings in every possible way in the home and the business place must be pursued. These austerity measures have to be applied by the Government and Citizens alike. The time has come when we are challenged to get more from less. However, I am confident that this too shall pass.

I expressed the position in previous articles about the need to expand the income of the household by more family members finding jobs. The unemployed can no longer sit around and wait for the ideal job. It is timely to remind my readers that there is dignity in labour. Those who are already employed need to seek out opportunities for the second and third job. We need our people to be industrious.

In spite of all the financial problems being experienced, credit is still freely available and the temptation is there for the people to incur further indebtedness. If ever self-control was necessary, it is now! Should the cost of living continue to escalate there will be a serious financial crisis. I sincerely hope that our people will not find themselves living in tents as the Americans who were thrown out of their homes due to their inability to upkeep their mortgages.

#### **#34 TAKING RESPONSIBILITY FOR OUR ACTIONS!**

TAKING RESPONSIBILITY FOR OUR ACTIONS!

It is BUDGET time again and Parliamentarians are busy trying to impress their constituents about the good, not so good or bad things that have happened or have not happened and what is to come. The long-awaited estimates of income and expenditure for 2008/2009 is now in the public domain.

While there is a lot that could be said for and against the budget, the reality is that looking on the positive side, it is a mouth full. I had to close my eyes while reading the document on line at intervals and imagine a St. Lucia in ten years' time. It is like a fairy tale but the future is filled with possibilities and if it can happen it will. What the Government needs to do is to declare 2008/2009 budget period – IMPLEMENTATION PERIOD. Time lines should be clearly stated so as the temper the expectations of the citizens. Show the people the works, put all foreign missions to work to attract friendly governments, donor agencies, investors and any agency that can help to implement the several projects that are on the drawing board or as some will prefer in the pipeline. My recommendation several years ago to appoint Trade and Investment Representatives around the world continues to be a worthwhile gesture as the Government is not in a position to support the amount of missions that will be necessary to promote and sustain investments in St. Lucia.

Today, we hear about over development, especially in the tourism sector. Hon. Philip J. Pierre was cautious in his response to questions on the subject and concluded that it was a chicken and egg situation. My take is that an increase in hotel plant/rooms will drive the destination and the thorny issue of airlift could be substantially improved. Even with the possibility of hoteliers forming alliances to provide their own charter flights from destinations that are overlooked by the established national airlines. There will always be a concern about the survival of the smaller hotels and a real strategy has to be worked out to attract visitors to fill their rooms. We are in an era where ideas must compete and if strategic planning, market research and marketing are still tools used by forward thinking companies, it will be a backward step to halt the progress that is currently being advanced.

I like what I hear about work permits and taxes amnesty. These are bold moves. In the interest of ensuring that we keep those skilled persons who remain in the region, CARICOM Nationals seeking employment should be encouraged to stay in the region. The work permit issue should be simplified as is done with the right of establishment in relation to establishing businesses across the region. Individuals should be able to apply for their own work permit instead of having employers securing their work permit. Work permits are not transferable and, in many instances, if there is a fall out between employer and employee, the worker in many cases is lost to the country as he/she leaves in search of employment elsewhere.

I called on the Government when it came into office to establish a Ministry of Innovation and Technology. Failing to see any action in that area, I made the call for a Secretariat of Innovation and Technology when the first Budget was about to be presented. Still nothing has happened. Maybe after reading the extract of a release from the OAS hereunder something tangible will be done to ensure that ICT at least is taken seriously.

The Assistant Secretary General of the Organization of American States (OAS) Ambassador Albert Ramdin in a recent encounter with policy makers, providers and experts attending the Joint ITU/CITEL Forum on "Enabling an ICT business environment in the Americas Region" called on them to put greater emphasis on applying innovation in information and communication technologies (ICTs) to address the needs of the poorest in society.

He also noted that this is an unprecedented opportunity for us to learn from your reflections from experience and your visions of the road ahead; I leave here some questions for your consideration on the debates that will follow.

- \* How do we create mechanisms to influence positive change in society by building partnerships amongst the private sector, civil society and member states to promote economic progress and opportunity for all?
- \* How can innovation in ICTs help us to address the need of the poorest?
- \* How to build, in developing countries, a culture of innovation and entrepreneurship in the ICT sector so that we can stimulate the creation of local producers of ICT applications and services?
- \* Which are the critical aspects of the telecommunications sector where we need to focus?
- \* How can we provide the environment in which individuals, entrepreneurs, and institutions can adapt to the changes around them, while gaining from them and forging the changes of the future?
- \* How we can create the right environment for businesses to develop and adopt new technologies?

We are yet to begin to utilize the Internet for implementing Internet Marketing Businesses that will have a global reach and make millions for their promoters. Let's have a conference on this business idea.

Lots of interesting things can happen for us but we need to understand what businesses are driving the economies of the developed world and how those businesses could be duplicated in our region.

THE BALANCING ACT OF SURVIVAL!

The 2008/2009 Budget was debated in the Lower House and the Senate. Citizens are fully aware of the various arguments raised by both parties but the budget went through its stages and is now passed. It is now time for action.

The issue of food security is no longer a mere talking point but an international crisis. Solutions to this crisis are high on the agendas of all regional governments. In recent times, the call was made for action but the crisis is well advanced of any real action taken to kick off the programmes that could guarantee food security. Guyana's failure whatever the reason/s to meet its obligation to supply rice and brown sugar to the region is another blow to regional trade, especially those items that are mandated to be sourced from within CARICOM.

The government has responded to the plight of the small man and has placed a basket of essential products under price control. With the prospects of declining business activities in the consumer sector, subsidies are likely to be threatened. Already there is decline in money transfers from the Diaspora in North America to relatives in the region. This is evidence that cost of living is hitting the rich countries as well as the poor.

Challenges to everyday living are usually diverted by entertainment events as is currently the case of St. Lucia Jazz that will bring joy to many citizens and visitors over the next nine days. The lineup is exciting and is going to give many persons the opportunity to take some much-needed respite after a Budget that has engaged citizens' attention who are grappling with the already high cost of living. With rising oil prices, things are likely to get worse before it levels out.

Individuals and business owners must avail themselves of every opportunity to inform and educate them in the art of surviving in today's cruel economic environment which is filled with uncertainties and anxieties. The OECS Secretariat Hub and Spokes Project in collaboration with the Government of Saint Lucia presented a 2-day Economic Partnership Agreement (EPA) Sensitization Seminar which was held at the Bay Gardens Hotel Conference Centre, Rodney Bay on April 28 & 29, 2008. The organizers lamented the poor turn out of the private sector. As the EPA approaches implementation stage, it will be necessary for all stakeholders to have an understanding of what the challenges and benefits are. The EPA is a Trade and Development Agreement. Information about the trading aspect is in the public domain but the development aspect is yet to be discussed in detail with stakeholders. This area of involvement needs urgent attention if the benefits to our people are to be maximized.

Mr. Hilton Jn Baptiste is the new President of SLISBA. He assumes the leadership of the Association at a critical time when it is being challenged to meet the needs of an expanding membership. Fortunately for him, his first meeting in the chair, he was given the commitment of the membership to be fully involved in the development and execution of the programmes of the association.

Labour Day 2008 could not have held much promise for workers around the world as members of trade unions prepared for a period of austerity filled with uncertainties. The Labour Code is back on the front burner. This is a very difficult time to negotiate such an agreement when the economy is in decline and businesses are struggling to keep their doors open.

No one can be sure of what tomorrow will bring. Companies' budgets have to undergo constant updating, many times reducing projected profits. Many businesses will experience shortfalls in sales and as a result profits, even navigating the storm with losses, hoping that the turbulent period will be short lived. Cost cutting measures and attention to details will have to be implemented by businesspersons.

In the meantime, while the developments of the past week take root, let us enjoy sweet jazz music for the next week. The organizers continue to ensure that Jazz is taken to the less fortunate in the rural communities. Many of us will be looking forward to welcoming visiting relatives and friends from overseas during this period. Have fun!

THE ST. LUCIA GOVERNMENT IMPASSE PARLIAMENTARIANS RUFUS BOUSQUET & MARCUS NICHOLAS WILL BE BACK IN THE CABINET!

It has been three weeks of turmoil in the Government of Prime Minister, Honourable Stephenson King. The main subject of the impasse was the removal of Senator Ausbert d'Auvergne who members on the Government's side in Parliament believed wielded too much power. However, there are mixed signals coming from the people as many believe Senator Douvergne is the man best suited to head the Ministry of Economic Affairs, Economic Planning, Investment & National Development. The call for his removal was also echoed by members of the party in opposition.

Senator Ausbert d' Auvergne finally tendered his resignation which takes effect May 31, 2008. This development cleared the way for Parliamentarians, Rufus Bousquet and Marcus Nicholas who had formally withdrew their support for Prime Minister to reverse their decision.

The Honourable Prime Minister addressed the nation on Tuesday evening 27/5/08 and informed the citizens about the developments in recent days and in going forward a new and reduced Cabinet will be announced shortly. No later than June 1, 2008. He noted that citizens have been patient with his Government and he intends to make up for lost time.

All representative associations of civil society expressed concern over the impasse in Government and called upon Prime Minister, Hon. Stephenson King to resolve the matter at the earliest. Relief finally came and the nation anxiously awaits the announcement of the new cabinet. A letter to the Prime Minister which appeared in the media highlighted the state of the economic and social problems of the nation. The St. Lucia Industrial and Small Business Association (SLISBA) detailed the problems facing the nation as a result of the state of affairs in the country in relation to governance. Extracts of the letter are detailed hereunder:

\*\*\*\*\*Our members have demanded that we as their representative do write to inform you of the hurt to that sector as follows:

- 1. Lack of business activity
- 2. Uncertainty with the security of the nation resulting in increased criminal activity.
- 3. The laying off of workers due to the down turn in activity in the sector.
- 4. Scarcity of Commodities
- 5. Escalating costs of doing business.
- 6. Reduce productivity due to the instability of the government.
- 7. Reduction in available finance to businesses.

The above are not exhaustive but are indicative of the seriousness of the situation.

We in the Small Business Sector, whilst sympathetic and understanding of the myriad of problems are at pains to understand why this situation has been allowed to deteriorate to this extent. The unfortunate and most difficult part of which is the lack of information reaching the public and the seemingly indecisions of your administration to date." \*\*\*

It continues to be a very difficult period for the Prime Minister but it seems that the people are uninterested in going back to the polls at this time and are still prepared to give the Government an opportunity to make good on its mandate.

In the meantime, the sun continues to rise every day and the citizens of the beautiful island Paradise – Saint Lucia are doing their best to keep hope alive. It is definite that the way the business of politics and governance are played out in St. Lucia will have to change. The period ahead will define the next steps whenever it is time for the people to prepare for elections. It is clear that if there was ever an opportunity for a serious third party, it is now.

We can only pray that the outstanding issues being resolved, the activities of the nation will return to normalcy.

#### OAS/YABT TO LAUNCH CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY PROJECT IN ST. LUCIA

Finally, St. Lucian businesses and industries will officially be a part of a global thrust to promote Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) in their enterprises. In recent years businesses were involved in philanthropic programmes as they attempted to reach out to their communities. Today, it is proven that CSR programmes enhance the goodwill of businesses and improve the bottom line of companies that practice CSR.

St. Lucia was selected to be one of five CARICOM Member States to participate in the OAS/YABT CSR pilot Project which began in 2007. The other countries are Barbados, Guyana, Jamaica and Trinidad & Tobago.

Following the introduction of the project in Trinidad in September of 2007, training programmes were held in all five States. Special training is continuing to equip Country Trainers who are expected to promote the virtues of CSR especially to SMEs. It is important to note that many large companies are already implementing and practicing CSR. In the case of St. Lucia, the Chamber of Commerce, Industry & Agriculture has recognized companies that subscribe to the principles of CSR at their Annual Awards Dinner.

The St. Lucia Project is scheduled to be launched with a three-day National Workshop, Monday – Wednesday, June 23 – 25, 2008 at the Royal St. Lucian Resort & Spa, Reduit Beach. The Seminar will be preceded by a Train the Trainer Workshop on Sunday, June 22, 2008. On Thursday, June 26, 2008 there will be a joint session with OAS/YABT and ISO where the International Standards Organization will introduce aspects of ISO 26000 which is expected to be launched in 2009. It is interesting to note that ISO 26000 is a Voluntary Standard.

Corporate Social Responsibility is expected to put a human touch to businesses as they seek to capture the hearts and minds of their customers and communities in which they operate. The time has come for a new approach to doing business which is based on caring and sharing – giving back.

What is CSR? A definition of CSR is in order. There are several definitions but the one hereunder should suffice:

Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) is a concept, which encourages organizations to consider the interests of society by taking responsibility for the impact of the organization's activities on customers, employees, shareholders, communities and the environment in all aspects of its operations. This obligation is seen to extend beyond the statutory obligation to comply with legislation and sees organizations voluntarily taking further steps to improve the quality of life for employees and families as well as for the local community and society at large.

It is anticipated that the nation will benefit in several ways as the results of the CSR project sweep across St. Lucia.

There is a new development whereby businesspersons who are skeptical about taking time off of their businesses to get involved in conferences/workshops providing information relating to entrepreneurial activities, will be left behind. This is the age of information. Entrepreneurs have to plan ahead and seek out opportunities to ensure the survival of their businesses. In recent times, I have discovered that conferences/workshops are delivering information that is necessary to meet the challenges of doing business. The benchmarking gives Entrepreneurs an opportunity to have an in-depth look at what successful businesses are doing. At least to know what they are competing with.

I am aware of the sacrifice that is necessary to keep up with the demand that is placed on the time of Entrepreneurs to attend meetings but it could be well worth the sacrifice. The opportunity afforded those persons who attended the conference on Profiling Economic Vulnerability and Economic Resilience in Small States: The Case of St. Lucia at the Gaiety Conference Centre, Massade, Gros Islet on June 16 & 17, 2008 was one such example of the quality of information that is shared with participants. My advice to my readers is not to sit on the fence and think of conferences/workshops as mere talk shops but instead attend and make your contribution.

JULY 23, 2008 – THE PROPOSED DATE FOR THE SIGNING OF THE EUROPEAN UNION AND CARIFORUM ECONOMIC PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT!!!

Several agencies involved in the Economic Partnership Agreement negotiations are busy discussing the pros and cons of the proposed agreement scheduled to be signed by Heads of Government in the Cariforum region on Wednesday, 23rd July, 2008. Many express doubts as to whether this will be possible as dissenting voices are being echoed by Governments across the region. CARIFORUM members include: Antigua and Barbuda, The Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Dominica, the Dominican Republic, Grenada, Guyana, Haiti, Jamaica, St. Kitts and Nevis, St. Lucia, St. Vincent and the Grenadines, Suriname, and Trinidad and Tobago.

President Jagdeo of Guyana is in the forefront of making public pronouncements as to his Government's displeasure with the agreement and in recent days Hon. Rufus Bousquet, Minister for Trade, Industry, Commerce, Consumer Affairs & Investment in Saint Lucia has also gone public to express concerns. It is interesting to note that while the dissenting voices are getting louder, Hon. Christopher Sinckler, Minister for Foreign Affairs, Foreign Trade and International Business of Barbados is yet to make a definitive statement on his Government's position that is carried by the region's media. Minister Sinckler is well known throughout the region for his work with the Caribbean Policy Development Centre (CPDC) on behalf of NGOs in general and for his outspoken position against the EPA prior to his appointment as a Minister, joining in protest meetings and demonstrations in the region and beyond. The Heads of Government can do with some guidance from Hon. Christopher Sinckler.

Two meetings were hosted in St. Lucia during the past week on the EPA, interestingly one was sponsored by the CPDC in collaboration with Christian Aid. The technocrats have been at pains to explain the several aspects of the proposed agreement since the initial agreement by Heads to proceed with the EPA as negotiated late last year.

St. Lucia is currently being the preferred destination for meetings and workshops in the OECS and it is noted that most of them run from two to four days. The demand to share information among stakeholders is growing and the agencies charged with various aspects of development within the region are busy at this time. It is definitely a race against time as on the one hand it's the CARICOM Single Market and Economy (CSME) and the EPA on the other.

It is great news for the region as the CSME Development Fund was finally launched by Heads of Government in Antigua on July 1, 2008. The original size of the Fund was set at US\$250,000,000.00 but was launched with US\$60,000,000.00. At least it is a step in the right direction. Mr. Patrick Joseph, a past President of the St. Lucia Industrial and Small Business Association (SLISBA) should be pleased with the announcement as he kept reminding the Leaders of their promise to implement the Fund.

Hon. Stephenson King is back in the country after a trip to the Republic of China on Taiwan and things are quiet on the front line of Government. In the meantime, the Government of Taiwan will be collaborating with the Government of Saint Lucia to mount an Exhibition of Taiwanese goods and services in Saint Lucia in October, 2008. Relationship between the two nations is progressing and there seems to be no shift in policy in relation to Saint Lucia under the new administration in Taiwan.

The greatest challenge to the Government and people of Saint Lucia is the rising cost of living. With the cost of oil continuing to rise with no end in sight, it is time for serious adjustments at all levels of society. Something will have to be done to arrest the situation.

The tourism sector is being challenged by contraction in the airline industry and the high cost of air travel. There has to be new approaches to the old problem of airlifts. Just when the future looked good, the oil crisis came along to rob us of the economic growth we anticipated.

Life goes on and there is need to be strong. Lifestyle changes are definitely on the cards. It is some conciliation in all that is going on in the world today that we realize that THIS TOO SHALL PASS.

While the Carnival revelry is taking place with such activities as Mass on the Square in the evenings, the Civil Society Network under the leadership of Ms. Flavia Cherry took to the Castries Market Steps calling on the Government to hold back on the privatization of the Water & Sewerage Company Inc. – WASCO. The several speakers included the President of the National Youth Council – Mr. Marvin Edgar and Past President of the National Consumers' Association – Mr. Andrew Antoine. They all called on the UWP Government not to renege on their Campaign Promise – not to privatize the Water Sector in St. Lucia. Ms. Cherry promised not to back down on the Water Issue and will take the issue to the streets with massive demonstrations if necessary.

Ms. Flavia Cherry is the President of Caribbean Association for Feminist Action and Research (CAFRA) – St. Lucia Chapter. This Association collaborates with the Caribbean Policy Development Centre (CPDC) on matters affecting civil society and provides necessary support to Governments on women's issues and trade. The two organizations' contribution to the Economic Partnership Agreement negotiations between the European Union and the Cariforum States have been invaluable and played a major role in drawing to the attention of the region's Governments flaws in the agreement and the need to hold off on signing at this time. The EPA should have been concluded on 23rd July, 2008.

While the EPA is still a work in progress, the region's governments are getting ready for trade negotiations with Canada. One of the issues at the very core of the EPA is that Caricom Governments will not be able to negotiate a more favourable agreement with any other State without giving the same treatment to the EU. Mr. David Singh a native of Guyana who migrated to Canada almost 35 years ago is bullish on investing in St. Lucia. He signaled his intention to build a multi-million-dollar Ultra-Modern Medical School in Vieux Fort at a groundbreaking ceremony on Wednesday 29th October, 2008. Construction is expected to commence by November 1, 2008. The project is located next to the Windward and Leeward Brewery Limited (producers of the internationally famous Piton Beer) on the St. Jude's Highway, about a quarter of a mile from the St. Jude's Hospital.

Attendees included the Prime Minister, members of his Cabinet, Government and Private Sector Officials, Entrepreneurs and Professionals who witnessed the unveiling of the architectural design of the project. The opportunity was also taken to announce that Destiny Group of Companies will donate to the Victoria Hospital a Mammography Machine to assist in the early detection of Breast Cancer in women.

The Destiny University School of Medicine & Health Sciences is currently operating as a distance learning university at renovated premises formerly the Sandy Beach Hotel. When the University facilities are fully established in 2010, St. Jude's Hospital could benefit substantially from its presence in the area.

While there are signals that suggest a slowing down in the economy and in particular the construction sector, the Destiny University Medical School and Health Sciences project will begin long awaited construction activity in the south of the island, while the start of the Ritz Carlton project is being eagerly awaited.

There is evidence of another Medical School that is currently operating in Vieux Fort is likely to construct their own facility in the new year. A sign on the adjacent land indicates their interest in establishing their own campus facility.

It has been a long time coming and the year 2009 is very likely to be the year that will change View Fort for the better, fulfilling its role as the new development frontier. The infrastructure was put in place several years ago but until now is greatly under-utilized. If it can happen, it will and it is about time that prosperity returns to Vieux Fort.

St. Lucians continue to closely monitor the trends in the financial markets and the oil price in particular which has been moving steadily downward. However, the price of gasoline and diesel at the pumps is still EC\$12.95 / US\$4.77 per gallon. Citizens have not been too vocal in demanding that prices at the pumps be adjusted due to the fact that the Government subsidized petrol at the pumps for a few months and is heavily subsidizing cooking gas, flour and a few other basic food items.

There are lots of developments at the regional and sub regional level and St. Lucia is fully committed to participating in these initiatives. OECS and Trinidad & Tobago Economic Union, OECS Economic Union, European Partnership Agreement, CARICOM – Canada Trade Agreement and CARICOM Single Market are all very much on the front burner.

Regional and international meetings are once again being hosted at the level prior to the oil crisis and increased airfares. It is difficult these days to secure conference facilities to host workshops, conferences and meetings. Hotels are benefiting as they are to keep their employees during the slow periods. We are expecting a great cruise ship season but Senator, The Honourable Allen Chastanet, Minister for Tourism and Civil Aviation continues to grapple with the issue of airlifts. With the declining oil prices, the possibility exists for a rethinking of the routes by the major airline companies and our own regional carriers like Air Jamaica and Caribbean Airways. God knows we can do with some cheaper airfares.

I cannot conclude my article without noting the developments taking place in the Presidential Campaigns in the USA. History is in the making and with an Obama WIN; the world will be a better place. Let us pray for a people's victory on November 4, 2008. I will be watching and cheering and shouting just as much as you as I participate in a special election watch which is being organized by the newly formed American Chamber in St. Lucia.

ST. LUCIA'S HOSTING OF CHTA CARIBBEAN MARKET PLACE - VERY TIMELY!

The CHTA Caribbean Market Place hosted in Saint Lucia from January 18 – 20, 2009 was very timely as it has put Saint Lucia into focus at a very critical time in the industry. Global tourism industry movers and shakers have noted the achievement of Saint Lucia in hosting such an event. The collaboration among the organizers and sponsors is worthy of the highest commendation. It has been proven once again that working together, great things can be achieved.

The Caribbean Hotel Association (CHA) was founded in 1962 and in 2008 became Caribbean Hotel and Tourism Association (CHTA) in an effort to embrace all stakeholders – businesses and organizations in the industry. It has a membership of more than 800 member hotels and 750 allied members. You can visit their website at http://www.caribbeanhotelandtourism.com

The St Lucia Hotel and Tourism Association in collaboration with the St. Lucia Tourist Board, Ministry of Tourism and Civil aviation and the Caribbean gave a fitting welcome to the visitors at the Opening and Awards Ceremony at the Gaiety on Sunday evening, 18th February, 2009.

St. Lucia has received yet another award for being an excellent destination. This time it is the Star Diamond Award from the American Academy of Hospitality Sciences. Mr. Joseph Cinque, President of the Academy presented a plaque to Prime Minister, Hon. Stephenson King who approvingly passed it on the Senator, Hon. Allen Chastanet whose efforts in promoting St. Lucia as a destination of choice is tireless. It was a great evening for the Honourable Minister as it was announced that finally the Caribbean Destination Marketing Plan has been approved.

St. Lucia took advantage of the opportunity to launch its BRAND during Caribbean Market Place 2009 while the local, regional and international media were on hand. It was a proud moment marked with fanfare as the SAINT LUCIA BRAND was unveiled. You can now let your imagination soar to the heavens with what you perceive Saint Lucia to be. There is a lot more to Saint Lucia than being simply beautiful. It is no longer Saint Lucia – Simply Beautiful – there is no tag line to the BRAND. There should be a competition to get an idea of what citizens and visitors perceive Saint Lucia to be. The Tourism Master Plan was shared with the gathering and the Village Tourism Concept was well received.

The statistics provided by the organizers are impressive and point to the fact that interest in the tourism industry continues to be strong. There was a total of 406 booths lining the corridors at Caribbean Market Place 2009 as 1,366 delegates gathered to meet to and discuss marketing initiatives that are needed to spur demand for Caribbean vacations.

This is the first time in a decade that the number of booths topped the 400 mark. There were 397 booths in 2008 and 371 booths in 2007.

There were 871 supplier delegates ready to meet with 298 buyers from 124 partner wholesaler tour operator companies from more than 20 countries worldwide. This compares favourably to a year ago when there were 908 supplier delegates. However, the number of buyer companies has decreased as consolidation in the industry continues to shrink the number of wholesalers worldwide. The 12,292 scheduled appointments were second in number to the record set last year, indicating that interest in meetings between suppliers and buyers remains strong. (Statistics extracted from Media Contacts KTCpr 20/1/09).

I had the privilege and pleasure of attending 10 press conferences, two press lunches and on press breakfast which provided me with a good sense of where the industry is today and where it is headed over the next three years. In spite of the global economic down turn, industry leaders during their presentations have expressed a degree of confidence that they will be able to ride out the storm.

It is important to note that CHTA Caribbean Market Place is an annual Event which showcases tourism related services to promote the offerings of its members and is hosted by one of the countries in the region. St. Lucia is the first to host a Market Place in the Eastern Caribbean.

I took the opportunity to discuss with two Ritz Carlton Marketing Executives prior to and at their Press Breakfast, the status of their Black Bay project. They clarified a situation which most people do not fully understand. It is necessary to differentiate between a Developer and an Operator. There is a developer for the Black Bay property. Ritz Carlton will be the operator when the property is completed and handed over. However, it makes good sense for Brand association throughout the development of the project. The project is scheduled for completion in 2012.

Customers Incentives are high on the marketing agenda of hoteliers as some offer substantial discounts while others offer value added. Both approaches reduce the bottom line but the later maintains a pricing level that will be easily retained beyond the crisis and does not diminish the premium status established in the first place. The value-added approach seems to be favoured by the high-end properties.

Hon. Richard Skerritt, Minister of State for Tourism, Sports and Culture at St. Kitts Press Conference shared his Government's efforts at sustaining the industry. He made special reference to a package of incentives which includes Free entry on import of materials, machinery, food and wine that is being given to small hotels to assist them in cutting cost during these difficult times, while affording them the opportunity to upgrade their hotels and be more efficient. He noted that timely reports on their operations will have to be provided.

I was very impressed with the presentation by Mrs. Ronella Tjin Asjoe-Croes, Director of Tourism at the Bonaire Press Conference. She demonstrated that with passion for your industry, your story could inspire your listeners to dream. Bonaire has been on the upward trend in recent years and has established a place for itself as a leading windsurfing destination. Her presentation was centered on expansion and gains made in the industry.

St. Lucian service providers and volunteers have done a great job and their performance attests to the quality of service that is available in St. Lucia. Hoteliers have taken note of this and are planning to recruit St. Lucians in the industry to take up appointments overseas. Our taxi drivers also came in for high praise. St. Lucia is a special place and its people shine every time. Bay Gardens Resort catered for on-site meals and served as much as 1,300 lunches on the last day of event. This is a great achievement for a small hotel.

The reception and show at Pigeon Island on 20/1/09 gave St. Lucians another opportunity to appreciate their culture, especially our local artistes. It was an opportunity well utilized to showcase our culture to the visitors.

What is the legacy? I was reminded that the efficiency of the volunteers was as a result of the training received in preparation for CWC 2007 and their subsequent participation in the event. The legacy of Caribbean Market Place 2009 will be the focused PR provided by the Journalists to the world. The decision to host the event at this time will pay dividends even when the filed reports to media houses around the world rest in their archives.

It was the Budget 2009/2010, then there in the midst of the uneasiness of the public sector, the number one party in the Caribbean was just in time to present a diversion from the financial woes and job uncertainty being experienced by many.

The 18th Jazz event formerly St. Lucia Jazz Festival, now St. Lucia Jazz was a memorable one in many ways. Officials of the Tourist Board expressed satisfaction with the level of visitor and local participation. The spotlight was definitely on Amy Winehouse and St. Lucia got a lot of media exposure as journalists monitor her every move in St. Lucia. Her performance was the worst ever staged at the event and the discussions will continue for a long time regarding the impact of her performance on the event.

All the negatives aside, the event was well received and patrons got value for their money. The local participation in this year's event was significant and their performances were outstanding. This development is very encouraging and the future of the music industry seems set for the next level. It is now accepted that St. Lucia has talented artistes and musicians.

Carnival 2009 was promoted during the Jazz event in an effort to secure the participation of patrons during the season. The National Cultural Foundation under new management is expected to deliver an outstanding Carnival Season 2009. This timing of Carnival will this year more than any other in recent times offer a welcome diversion from the financial crisis that will be at its fiercest at that time as parents attempt to cope the summer holiday demands of their children and their back to school requirements. Dancing in the streets will be therapy for many.

The demand by public servants for final payment of 7.5 percent on their negotiated 14.5 percent package has met with resistance from the government which claims that it cannot afford to pay the entire amount due at this time and has made a counter offer of 3 percent. The teachers are demanding 100 percent of the amount due while public servants are prepared to accept 4.5 percent with the balance payable within 12 months. It will be unfortunate if a compromise is not reached as any further disruption to the economy will be crucial. The deadline that is given by the unions is May 26, 2009. If an agreement is not arrived at there is a threat of strike action. St. Lucia cannot afford such a situation at this time and everything should be done to avert such a crisis.

Allocations in the Budget are very likely to be released during the month of June as contracts are finalized and serious work begins on the many projects especially in the construction sector. Serious emphasis has to be placed on the tourism sector. The 45-million-dollar allocation for promoting the destination must be spent in areas that will produce the best results and innovative ways of reaching potential visitors must be found. Embrace all those persons who will like to assist in promoting St. Lucia.

This is a very difficult period to predict the future, even in the short term but there seem to be some significant developments that give hope. There has been a surprise prediction that the recession will be reversed by the end of 2009 and that is the best news we can get at this time. The 2009/2010 tourist season will definitely be better than 2008/2009 and our lead sector will be back on track. The cruise sector is doing fine and it seems as though the Eastern Caribbean is getting some increased traffic as a result of the H1N1 Flu. So far St. Lucia has not recorded any case of the flu and it is hoped it stays that way.

It is time to take a positive look at the future and play your part to bring about the necessary changes that are so necessary to ease the current financial crisis.

Whether Guyana is poorer than Haiti and St. Lucia are now just as poor, there is business to be done regardless. My own take is that Guyana and St. Lucia in no way can be compared with the economic status of Haiti. There is room for serious debate how the recent conclusion on the state of poverty has been arrived at by the Consultants. It is important that if there is any inaccuracy in the findings that it be corrected in the shortest possible time at it can affect the psyche of our people.

It is quite obvious that unemployment is a major indicator in measuring poverty but St. Lucia doesn't seem to be in the category it has been placed. However sometimes the situation could be far different from what it appears to be. Looks can be deceiving. It is time we sit up and took a deep breath, look around us and put our statisticians to work on the numbers. If the Consultants who produce the report are correct, we are in some deep trouble, especially when we expect the economic woes to deepen in our part of the world.

If only the need to take warning of the impeding situation, it is time that the Government, regional and international agencies do everything within their power to advance entrepreneurship in the region. A major step is exciting entrepreneurs to the opportunities that exist even in these difficult times. Most of all expose them to business opportunities through, exhibitions, workshops, seminars and conferences that will replace fear with confidence.

The truth is that as the financial crisis deepens in the region, disposable incomes are going to be challenged. Yes, consumers will have to make hard decisions in many areas in their lives and in the end, they will have to tighten their belts. This does not mean that there are no longer viable businesses. That is far from the truth.

This past week saw the Embassy of The United States of America in Barbados with responsibility for the OECS and Monroe College collaborating with SLISBA to present a Lecture on SMEs by Mr. Chuck Mills, President of Salera Capital Management of Reston, Virginia, USA. Mr. Mills' presentation was like music to the ears of his audience. He has a very exciting background which included being a Helicopter Pilot who fought in combat and flew two Presidents, namely Presidents George W. Bush and Bill Clinton respectively. He worked on Wall Street and now manages his own business.

He lectured in many countries including Brazil and South Africa. He talked about the purpose of Incubators and their ability to mold business persons and set them on the road to success, utilizing the power of networking. He alluded to the importance of training and stressed that while most people apply great importance to finance, he placed training as the number one priority. Aspects of sourcing and managing finances were discussed at length in his presentation.

Ms. Flavia Cherry, recently elected President of SLISBA is very much up to the challenge of taking the Association to the next level. She was encouraged by the attendance of members of the Association and other business persons.

BUSINESS MISSION REPORT - GUYANA IS OPEN FOR BUSINESS!!!

Visionary Investment Consultants in association with the Office of the Honorary Consul for Guyana to Saint Lucia concluded a successful Business Mission to Guyana. The group comprised of twenty-three St. Lucians representing manufacturing, distribution and services sectors. Seven Associations were represented. The visit coincided with GUYEXPO 2009 held from October 1 – 6, 2009 in Georgetown.

Officials in the Guyana Office for Investment (GO-Invest) did a great job in ensuring the necessary courtesies were extended to members of the Business Mission and that they were provided with information that will encourage them to do business in Guyana. Members of the Mission were met at the airport, assisted with immigration and customs formalities and dropped off at their hotel. Their return to the airport on the date of their departure was also facilitated by the Agency.

St. Lucia's had the largest overseas delegation and was recognized in every major statement regarding participation. The St. Lucia Booth was used in the promotional advertisements on television and was visited by thousands of individuals. Several interviews were done on site.

During their five day stay in Guyana, members of the Mission were engaged in the following activities.

Day1. Attendance at the Official Opening Ceremony of GUYEXPO 2009. The theme of the exposition was "Promoting Business in a Low Carbon Environment". The gathering heard addresses from His Excellency, President Bharrat Jagdeo, Hon. Manniram Prashad, M.P., Minister for Tourism, Industry & Commerce, Mr. Derrick Cummings, Co- Chairman – GUYEXPO 2009 and Mr. Gerald Gouveia, Chairman – Private Sector Commission. After the ceremony, invitees were allowed to view the Exposition which consisted of over 200 booths which showcased goods and services provided by participating companies.

Day 2. Members of the Mission attended an Investment Seminar at the Conference Centre, on the East Coast of Demerara. This seminar was rescheduled from Wednesday 30/9/09 to Friday 2/10/09 to accommodate members of the Mission. Hon. Manniram Prashad, Minister for Tourism, Industry & Commerce traced the development of the economy from 1992 to the present and highlighted the following:

- a) From a situation where Government controlled 85% of the economy and there was no role for the private sector to an open economy. From 90% of national revenue paid towards debt service in 1994 to 4% currently.
- b) Nationalized state owned properties were given back to private enterprise.
- c) Guyana is the freest economy in the region.
- d) Free to buy and sell property, no restrictions. 10% Capital Gains Tax is applicable.
- d) Huge opportunity to acquire agricultural lands by serious investors in the sector.
- e) Developing relations with Brazil will change the business dynamics in the region. The Takatu Bridge and the road infrastructure will open up access to a new shipping route for Brazil through Guyana.
- f) Tourism is new to Guyana but steady growth is being realized. The Brazil/Guyana road will further develop the industry. Entrepreneurs were invited to get involved in small guest houses/lodges in the Lethem area. Guyana is forging ahead as a Nature and Adventure destination.

Hon. Manniram Prashad was so moved by the interest of the St. Lucian participants that he extended an invitation to them to visit Baganara Resort along the Essequibo River on Sunday 4/10/09.

Mr. Geoffrey Da Silva, Chief Executive Officer – Guyana Office for Investment in his address highlighted the achievement of his Agency and drew attention to:

- a) The influx of proposals from Investors seeking to set up businesses in Guyana. His agency received for the period January to September, 2009, 348 project applications.
- b) Keep Brazil in mind when considering investing in Guyana.
- c) No foreign exchange control. Foreign exchange accounts allowed with Bank of Guyana approval. Full and unrestricted repatriation of profits.
- d) Special Sector Incentives available. Unlimited carry over of losses from previous years.
- e) Opportunity to export to markets outside CARICOM Brazil, Colombia and Venezuela, 3 countries with a population of 320 million.
- f) Hot spots for investment in Guyana are Lethem, Linden and Corentyne. Guyana is currently hosting investors from 24 countries and forging closer relations with China, India and Brazil.
- g) There are 8 sectors which are currently being developed, namely: 1. Petroleum, 2. Gas, 3. Solar Power, 4. Hydro Power, 5. Bio Fuels, 6. Bio Diesel, 7. Wind Power, 8. Cogeneration from Rice Dust.
- h) Gold Production is on the rise, Call Centres and ICT services are expanding.
- i) Concessions could be finalized between 3 to 6 weeks.
- j) Efficient supply of Electricity and Bandwidth are two challenges that solutions are being actively pursued.

He cautioned employers to ensure that employees are properly compensated and encourage them to "work smarter and better, rather than harder and cheaper"

Some members attended One on One prearranged Meetings while others toured the Caricom Secretariat in the afternoon and met with Heads of Departments and other officials.

Day 3. One on One Meetings continued, Shopping Trip & Evening with St. Lucian Hosts.

Day 4. Boat trip to Baganara Resort.

Day 5. a) Meeting with Supplier of PreFab Timber Houses and other wood products. b) Wrap up meetings and final visit to Exposition.

The stage is set for members of the Mission to share their experiences with associates and members of their respective Associations. Guyana is open for Business in all sectors and it is up to those who have been exposed to the information on investing in Guyana to take advantage of the opportunities.

Immediate opportunities are available for the importation of wood products, sea food products, craft items and pharmaceuticals. Opportunities are available for joint ventures in a number of areas. It is important for St. Lucian entrepreneurs to get together and invest in Guyana. Follow up will be necessary to undertake further investigations in possible areas of investment.

It has been a rewarding experience and many of the members of the group have committed to pursuing business with their counterparts. Thousands of Guyanese know a bit more about St. Lucia and many have expressed an interest in visiting St. Lucia to invest or for a vacation.

# #60 PROFESSOR COMPTON BOURNE URGES BETTER COLLABORATION BETWEEN CARICOM GOVERNMENTS AND THE PRIVATE SECTOR

PROFESSOR COMPTON BOURNE URGES BETTER COLLABORATION BETWEEN CARICOM GOVERNMENTS AND THE PRIVATE SECTOR

The University of the West Indies (UWI) Open Campus Saint Lucia in conjunction with the Doctorate of Business Administration (DBA) cohort two (2) of the Cave Hill School of Business (CHSB) hosted a half day seminar on the topic, "Entrepreneurship and Growth" on Saturday 27th February 2010. Professor Compton Bourne, President of the Caribbean Development Bank, served as Facilitator.

Professor Compton Bourne's experience in Business welded with his accomplishments as an academic undoubtedly brought significant value to the topic which is of relevance to the current global economic recession.

Those who attended the seminar got a glimpse into understanding today's economic trends and the importance of niche marketing. Professor Bourne noted that:

- No more protection of markets. Business people have to face the competition.
- Innovative Entrepreneurship is a scarce commodity and it is necessary to structure a system of incentives and rewards. Sometimes, it is necessary for governments to set the pace but it is for businessmen to innovate and create new markets.
- Economic Agencies should be flexible and change in accordance with the needs of the time.
- Procrastination shrinks margin of profit such as delay on the wharf, etc.
- Decision makers must be quick to spot a difficulty that needs to be addressed and take decisive action.
- It is necessary to create a framework in which the business community plays a larger role in shaping policy and giving urgency to policy.
- The Diaspora can be an important element in growth of trade in Food Products.

The Question and Answer period was very lively and it was generally agreed that there are many initiatives that can be taken to reverse the negative economic trend. New activities will have to be found to generate sustainable income. Areas such as Knowledge Transfer, Solar Heating, Sports Tourism, etc. – simply finding the right niches should be pursued.

Listening to Professor Bourne was a re awakening to the many calls I made in the past to get government to be the driver in areas that only political direction can yield the desired results. Sometimes, government has to set the pace, it is their call. There are initiatives for the government to undertake and there are initiatives for the private sector to undertake. Sometimes achieving a specific goal will take collaboration to yield the best results.

I have just achieved one of my major goals in life – to be a published author. It is great to be in Saint Lucia in spite of the ravages left behind by Hurricane Tomas. I sympathize with persons who have lost family and friends. I am more than ever convinced that we never know when we will be called to higher service, and it is necessary for us to live each day as if it is our last – loving each other.

Once again, it has been my privilege and pleasure to visit the continent of Africa, this time – The United Republic of Tanzania, www.tanzania.go.tz The United Republic of Tanzania was formed out of the union of two sovereign states namely Tanganyika and Zanzibar. Tanganyika became a sovereign state on 9<sup>th</sup> December, 1961 and became a Republic the following year. Zanzibar became independent on 10<sup>th</sup> December, 1963 and the People's Republic of Zanzibar was established after the revolution of 12<sup>th</sup> January, 1964. The two sovereign republics formed the United Republic of Tanzania on 26<sup>th</sup> April, 1964. However, the Government of the United Republic of Tanzania is a unitary republic consisting of the Union Government and the Zanzibar Revolutionary Government. Those of us who are old enough will remember President Julius Nyerere.

The country has the largest concentration of wild animals. It also has pristine sandy beaches and Africa's highest and snow-capped mountain, Mt. Kilimanjaro. Tanzania is home to the world famous National Parks and Game Reserves of: Ngorongoro Crater, Selous Game Reserve, Gombe Stream, Tarangire, Lake Manyara, Mikumi, Arusha, Ruaha, Saadani, Udzungwa Mountains, and Mkomazi Game Reserve. Other Game Reserves include: Amani, Kigosi, Lukwika-Lumesule, Maswa, Monduli Mountains, Msangesi and Ugala.

Many of our young people are not aware of the days when African countries were gaining their independence from their colonial masters and were introducing their version of socialism which appealed to their people. Our people in the Caribbean need to know more about Africa. African History should be taught in schools.

Tanzania has an area of 947,300 square kilometers and a population on forty million. Tanzania is now a part of the East African Community which includes **5** of the 8 border countries (highlighted): Burundi, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Kenya, Malawi, Mozambique, Rwanda, Uganda and Zambia, a market of 130 million with prospects of expanding when the three other nations join. Since my return, I have been sharing my experiences with my friends and I get the feeling that many of them are beginning to realize the need to visit the Mother Land. My colleagues are very keen on visiting Tanzania in March of 2011. Plans will be put in place to formalize a Business/Familiarization Mission shortly.

I was invited by a friend to spend a few months in the City of Arusha which is one of the principal tourist areas in Tanzania where I wrote three books and made a study of the publishing business. Since I returned to St. Lucia I have been speaking with Writers and finding out more about experiences of Published Authors. I am encouraged by the fact that many young people are attracted to the vocation. Miss Syreeta "Tu-Che" Alcee' – author, song writer, singer and entrepreneur is making a serious statement in the digital and print media. #### **INTERNET WOES!**

The situation online is cause for concern as the scam artists are using creative means to get information from internet users that shouldn't be shared. The compelling appeal of the scammers can cause you to submit the information they humbly request if you are not knowledgeable about the various strategies they apply. Whether it is to get your password to your email account/s or to lure you into scams such as to share a large sum of money which you will help to retrieve, your email was drawn in a lottery sponsored by major corporations, etc.

The list of scams is mounting everyday as the economic problems take away legitimate opportunities. The unfortunate situation is that many internet scams can be very deceiving as they appear to be real. Even when a product is offered you can be cheated because it is does not represent value for money.

Almost every type of scam has landed in one of my several inboxes. It is interesting how these promoters can really ignore real opportunities to earn legitimate money and turn to promoting scams. It is worth looking into these scams as legitimate programmes could be developed from them. Many years ago, I read a book on turning illegitimate business into legitimate business and that is exactly what is possible in many instances if you redirect the strategies of the scam artists.

I have discovered that it is necessary to know who the principal promoter of an internet offering is. Many offers are launched without this basic information. In startups I have seen nothing under the about us link. Many times, they rush the launch and earlier participants pay the full price while the offer is still being developed. This is unfair. However, there are very few players in today's get rich quick by any means world who apply ethical standards in their businesses. The US Government has been dealing with pyramid scams when detected. I received a total refund on one occasion but I suspect that was at the tail end when the Agency had already moved in on the company's operation.

Is the internet a safe place? My answer is no, since there are reports of hackers shutting down major sites. In the past, there were all types of viruses which are not as prevalent these days. I cannot over emphasize the point that in using the internet, we must exercise caution. You must be extremely careful with the use of debit cards as there is no recourse to recovering your money if unscrupulous internet marketers defraud you of your hard-earned money. This article is not intended to scare my readers but rather to alert them to the silent war that is ongoing in cyber space between honest users, and scammers and hackers.

If a proposition looks too good to be true, then it is. While getting in on the ground floor is the best way in getting big returns from Multi-Level Marketing programmes, it is very risky as many of these programmes fail before being fully established. It is very interesting to see how even the weakest propositions attract substantial following. In recent times, many companies introduce their offerings with a Prelaunch programme where individuals are invited to participate with a promise to be rewarded with persons being placed under them when the programme is launched.

I have seen programmes which never passed the prelaunch stage as the approach was used to build a massive mailing list. In some instances, these scams are even extended if the response is good. In the internet marketing business, the money is in the list. Your list provides your customer base and your sales force. There should be list sharing among persons seeking to market their products on a global scale. Joint Venture marketing is one way of getting access to other internet marketers' lists.

I continue to lament the fact that there is urgent need for drivers to promote the Internet Marketing Industry in Saint Lucia. The political season is once again with us and this is the time to get commitment from the politician vying for office. Get a commitment from your candidate on Innovation and Technology so that the creative minds in our midst can go to work on producing ideas and businesses that will open up new opportunities for investment, learning new skills and employment.

Something must be done to develop a new mind set whereby our young persons will see new opportunities in areas where they can apply their skills. It is fashionable these days to be on Facebook, Twitter, Myspace and other social media but we keep to the social aspects and fail to take advantage of the powerful business tool that social media offers. It was an opportunity missed by Entrepreneurs on Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> June, 2011 when the St. Lucia Chamber of Commerce & Industry in collaboration with Office of Private Sector Relations (OPSR) hosted Directors of the British Virgin Islands Investment Club to share their experiences. The Club was represented by Mrs. Margaret Penn and Mr. Glenn Harrigan, 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President and Treasurer respectively. They were accompanied by Ms. Ermyn Richardson, Executive Assistant.

I am fully convinced that I am correct in my constant plea to business persons to come together to seek alternatives to dealing with the current economic crisis and general changes in the global business environment.

If you were to undertake a survey among business persons today, asking the question – what is the greatest hindrance to your company's success? There will be one resounding answer – MONEY! We, in this part of the world were not fortunate to get Stimulus Packages from our governments but the reality is business persons should be able to at least get Cash Flow Assistance. Many persons in the present business environment cannot meet their current obligation with their bank, and find it extremely difficult to request additional facility. As a result, they are using their suppliers as their bankers and putting further hardship on them as they grapple with their own overseas suppliers. It gets even worse in the manufacturing sector.

What then is the alternative? My take is that while business persons struggle with their existing businesses, an aggressive approach should be taken to mobilize finances and seek out non-traditional businesses which are emerging currently. The days of the one-man show is over. The BVI Investment Club was launched on the  $26^{th}$  of September, 1992, almost 20 years ago, but in the first 10 years, it established itself as a force to be reckon with. I will share with you the story as I heard it. Twenty-four individuals got together, each contributed US\$1,000.00. In their first year of operation an opportunity presented itself to acquire CCT Boatphone from Ameritech Corporation, and in a partnership with Falconwood Corporation, Boston Communications and Columbia Capital, the deal was formally concluded on the  $8^{th}$  of December,1993.

The Club continued to identify opportunities for its members and went on to make some very valuable investments among members of the club and the general public by offering shares in the open market.

November 25, 1994, purchased 17 acres of land which was sub dived into lots and fully sold out.

September 12, 1996, purchased 45 % in Ocean Conversion Limited. On February 21, 1997, 25% was successfully sold BV Islanders and Belongers.

October 10, 1997, the Club in partnership with the Gibbons family, officially launched Colonial (BVI) Limited, the BVI's first locally owned insurance company.

April 25, 2000, the Club with the assistance of Prudential Securities, ventured into the US Stock Market.

May 2, 2000, the Club assisted in establishing three other Clubs, namely Quest Investment Club, Nottingham Estate Investment Club and C-Tech Investment Club.

April 15, 2002, the Club through its member-owned company Sage Investments Limited successfully sold approx. 15% of its ownership in CCT Boatphone to over 600 members of the BVI public.

April 26, 2002, the Club launched the BVI Investment Club Foundation.

The foregoing was achieved in the Club's first ten years of existence. This phenomenal achievement was based on a strong vision – "A vision of securing for all BVI Islanders and Belongers their rightful place in the development of the British Virgin Islands." There are five principles that guide the membership of the Club. 1. A shared vision and passion about the role which BVI Islanders and Belongers must play in the future economic development of the territory; 2. Mutual respect for each member as an individual; 3. Equity in investment; 4. A fundamental trust in each other, and 5. A deep trust and belief in the collective wisdom of the members of the Club.

I have always contended that we must trust each other before we can do business with each other. Serious emphasis was placed on the word TRUST. The BVI Investment Club is a success story for the private sector as the Eastern Caribbean Central Bank is for the Governments of the OECS.

It must be noted that the Club from humble beginning was able to negotiate with the Development Bank, Commercial Banks and finally place some offers on the stock exchange, Can this business model be successful in other parts of the region? My answer is, Yes – it can. Election Campaigning is raging across the countries of Guyana and Saint Lucia and the Nationals of both countries are caught up in the heightened political fever of the moment. In Guyana 31 parties were considering to do battle against the incumbent – PPP/Civic, in the end 7 parties presented their list of candidates on Nomination Day – October 27, 2011. Elections were last held in Guyana on the 28<sup>th</sup> of August 2006. The officials at Guyana Elections Commission (GECOM) the agency responsible for supervising the election process must be relieved due to the reduction in the number of parties.

The parties contesting the upcoming elections are as follows: The incumbent People's Progressive Party/Civic; the opposition coalition headed by the PNC now A Partnership for National Unity (APNU); Alliance For Change (AFC); The United Force (TUF); Horizon and Star; East Berbice Development Association (EBDA), and the Fundamental Structure Group (FSG). There are only three parties that will start and finish the race, namely in alphabetical order AFC, APNU and PPP/Civic; the others will not pass the finishing line.

I continue to ask the question – who came up with the grand idea to drop the name of the leading opposition party – the People's Nation Congress (PNC) which existed for several decades in favour of A Partnership for National Unity (APNU)? The party in 2006 fought the elections under the banner of the PNC/Reform. Why change now? What is the party faithful saying about this despicable act? How can a formidable political party sacrifice its name to others that have never been a challenge to the ruling PPP/Civic party? In the end it is the Alliance for Change (AFC) that is having the last laugh. While in Guyana, elections are scheduled for the 28<sup>th</sup> of November, 2011, the date for elections in Saint Lucia is yet to be announced. Will it be 2011 or 2012? The parties and independent candidate are taking no chances; they are already assembling at the starting line.

THE GUYANA ELECTORAL SCENARIO!

This is a very special time of year when people of Goodwill everywhere come together to share the joy of the Holidays. However, in Guyana and Saint Lucia, citizens are preoccupied with the adjustments that have to be made as they adapt to the new realities. While I will prefer to deal with the spirit of the Holidays, I feel obliged to deliver on the promise I made last week to discuss with my readers the Guyana electoral scenario after the general elections of November 28, 2011. Guyana and Saint Lucia held elections on the same date and both results produced surprises. In the case of Guyana for the first time under the existing constitution a hung parliament emerged.

I feel a sense of pride as I see what I fought for in 1997 and 2006 has finally been realized. I was involved in two political campaigns with the single purpose of producing a hung parliament. On the last occasion, I returned from Guyana with my left leg in a cast from my hip to my ankle. When asked by my friends what was the outcome of the elections? My response was, that I was cheated but not defeated. In 2006 the Alliance for Change (AFC) in nine months of existence, gained five (5) seats and began its march to fulfilling the dream of many to achieve electoral reform. This is now possible as the House of Parliament/National Assembly will for the first time since independence in 1966 will serve as a truly democratic institution. It began with the appointment of a Speaker. In times past it would have been an irrelevant detail, the PPP/Civic would have gone ahead and named a Speaker as was attempted, today it is a relevant issue. There must be consultation. The days ahead in Guyana will definitely be better. Democracy at last! This holiday season will be one of the best ever. President Donald Ramotar has an opportunity to fulfill the wish of the late President Cheddi Jagan to effect amendments to the constitution including the issue of electoral reform.

The present electoral system in Guyana allows for a minority party to assume the mantle of government and to administer the affairs of the nation. The party that gets the most seats in parliament forms the government. There is no provision for a COALITION Government in Guyana. Until December 28, 2011 the party with the most votes always received in excess of fifty percent of the ballots and it was easy to cruise along with a parliamentary majority. Unfortunately, the opposition parties had no voice as their contribution was not necessary. The government introduced motions and bills, and generally had their way.

Electoral Reform was never an issue as the ruling PPP/Civic party was quite satisfied with the constitution, especially in relation to the electoral system. I recall on one occasion when President Bharrat Jagdeo addressed Guyanese in St. Lucia, he referred to the fact that the constitution was written and passed in parliament by the PNC regime under the late President Forbes Linden Sampson Burnham, and his government saw no need to change it. Under the present constitution, electoral reform will need two thirds of the members of parliament to vote in favour of any amendment for it to become law.

In the National Assembly 65 members are elected through a closed-list proportional representation system to serve a five (5) year term. The President and Prime Ministerial Candidate head the list of candidates for each contesting party. Twenty-five (25) seats are divided between ten (10) geographical constituencies and forty (40) seats are in one, nation-wide constituency. There is a total of sixty (65) seats in parliament. The results produced 32 seats for the PPP/C, 26 seats for APNU (an alliance which includes the PNC) and 7 for the AFC. Voting for General and Regional elections is undertaken at the same time.

It is very difficult to write an article when one is emotionally involved. I hope however that my readers will be better informed about the electoral system in Guyana and I encourage you to use Google Search to further look into the electoral system that is different from all other countries in the region. Whereas all the other member states of CARICOM subscribe to FIRST PAST THE POST, Guyana has PROPORTIONAL REPRESENTATION. In the latter, the number of valid votes divided by the number of seats produces the number of votes needed to be accorded a seat. Then the number of votes received by each party is divided by the number of votes per seat. The party with highest number of left-over votes will be given the seat to arrive the final number of seats.

The people of Guyana in due course will achieve success in all their endeavours as they have spent many decades in preparation. The AFC is the party to watch in the years ahead. The contribution of the leadership of the party in the democratic process will be closely monitored and come 2016 elections, the AFC could be a major player in the politics of Guyana. I feel that the AFC is well prepared for its role in the future.

Citizens everywhere must also be prepared to make the best of opportunities as presented from time to time. This is my motivational piece of the week:

#### THE PRIVATE SECTOR IS NOT HOLDING BACK!

The challenges to life come in many forms and must not be allowed to overwhelm you. In today's mad world, you must be strong. Your faith in your ability to overcome obstacles must be deeply grounded. Everywhere there are challenges of one type or another. I have many challenges in my life but I am resigned to the fact that nothing lasts forever and some are gone faster than could ever be imagined. Never let your own challenges prevent you from doing what you should be doing for others.

The economic outlook for the region is far from being what can be considered reasonable. It is back to the drawing board; new strategies must be worked out to reposition our economies to be attractive to the Foreign Direct Investors. While tourists from Europe are being threatened by addition taxes on their travel tickets, the countries of the region are concerned that the new taxes will possibly dampen the enthusiasm of potential tourists to visit the region. Every country in the world is grappling with the issue of new and increased taxes as a means of balancing their budget. Europeans are not afraid to tax their citizens but American seem very reluctant to tax theirs, especially the rich.

Looking at developments at home, citizens are being called upon to exercise patience as it is obvious, it is not going to be business as usual. New ideas, necessitating new approaches will be the order of the day. I like the consultative approach being practiced involving some of our best minds. I have always alluded to the benefits of such an approach. I will like to see the process broadened. Get contributions from the people; in the final analysis, it is the people who will be the beneficiaries of the outcomes. The bottom up approach is necessary in these times. I remember an economist in earlier days who spoke about planning from below. What it simply means is to involve the people in the planning process.

A lot of funding went to the small business sector over the years but has any study been undertaken to really understand the real needs of the sector. As the new government seeks to implement its various plans, especially plans to deal with unemployment, the needs of the private sector in general and the small business sector in particular should be identified and addressed. In the past subventions were given to the representative body for MSMEs, many times too late. A serious look needs to be taken at the level of government support that should be given to SLISBA.

Most people will jump to the conclusion that micro and small businesses need adequate financing but there are more fundamental issues than money. Why MSME operators cannot pool their resources, financially and otherwise? What specific areas of training are necessary? The majority of small businesses are owned by persons advanced in age, 50 and over. The services sector is attracting younger persons but a substantial number of older persons are also involved. Demographic assessment, all these things should be informed by a comprehensive survey of the MSME sector.

While there are many issues within the MSME sector and generally the wider private sector, private associations are busy promoting their sectors. PONZI, PYRAMID AND MLM ARE NOT THE SAME!

If there is no product, or a product that is of no value to the customer who is not involved in the scheme then it could be considered an illegal pyramid. Pyramids never pay out more than they receive – Ponzi does.

A MLM model must offer a product but in recent times scammers have been offering low end products which only benefit the Distributor and not the end user, leaving them wide open for the FTC to step in. Pyramid scheme promoters have given the MLM industry a bad name as they attempt to disguise their offers.

- 4. St. Lucia is being challenged to continue to lead the economies of the small island states of the OECS.
- 5. St. Lucia must do more to improve its ranking in relation to the World Bank Report on 'Ease of Doing Business'. However, St. Lucia continues to be #1 in the OECS. (http://www.doingbusiness.org/data/exploreeconomies/st-lucia)
- 6. St. Lucia is currently paying approximately 0.75 cents on the dollar in Payroll, Pensions and Debt Servicing.

In spite of the facts stated above, St. Lucia is still a great place to live, work and offers great opportunity for new investments. The Government which assumed office on the 6th of June, 2016 has already established itself as an Investor friendly Government. Hence there is adequate growth potential.

Saint Lucia is named after its patron Saint, St. Lucy, and December 13th is annually celebrated as National Day. Observed the night before the holiday is the National Festival of Lights and Renewal in honour of St. Lucy of Syracuse who is also the saint of light. As part of the celebrations, decorative lights, mostly represented with a Christmas theme, are lit in Castries, the capital city. In time, this activity should take place in every community around the island.

The Pearl of the Caribbean project being promoted by Desert Star Holdings Limited is scheduled to commence its US\$2.6 Billion investment in St. Lucia early 2017. Anthony announced an 18-month construction stimulus package in an effort to jump start the economy which was very sluggish at the time. The stimulus package was launched in May, 2012 and was extended in response to calls from the business community and banks. The programme finally concluded on February 28, 2014.

Several concessions were granted, including lower Mortgage Rates, 5% for the first five years – the banks were very supportive. Government granted waiver of the 15% VAT and other customs levies on a list of construction items which included Sand, Cement, Lumber, Plywood, Steel Rods, Nails, Fencing, Roofing Sheets, Paints and other building materials. That was then.

Today, the construction sector is currently benefitting from competition among Suppliers of Hydraulic Cement for construction within the region and extra regionally as they are involved in a fierce battle for market share, giving developers and home owners a real opportunity to make substantial saving in the purchase of the product. A Supplier out of Turkey supported by a regional representative out of Barbados is currently introducing ROCKHARD Cement to the region at prices which made the regional Suppliers stand up and take note. The new product was introduced at a retail price of EC\$23.50 when a few Retailers were selling at EC\$27.95 with the lowest available price in limited supply at EC\$25.00 per sack. Cement is currently being sold at a wholesale price of EC\$19.04 ex-ship and EC\$22.67 at retail. There is substantial savings to be made if one is seeking to construct domestic or commercial buildings using concrete. Within a few weeks, prices for concrete blocks and ready mix will decline as block makers and suppliers of ready-mix concrete lock horns. The natural thing to expect is that Retailers of building materials will join in and offer substantial DISCOUNTS.

Hon. Dr. Kenny D. Anthony current Parliamentary Representative for Vieux Fort South and former Prime Minister stated that he wanted to designate Vieux Fort Town – University City where special incentives will be given to medical schools to locate in the South. It is very obvious that the Medical Schools in the South are expanding. A new development is taking place in the South of the island. Guest houses and large dwelling houses are being leased by Medical Schools to house students. There is urgent need for housing in the South and up to 25 room Guest Houses and Restaurants.

I can't help keeping Desert Star Holdings Limited in the news. It is the only big thing being talked about in the Caribbean. The long-awaited sensitization meeting will take place in Vieux Fort on the 8<sup>th</sup> of February, 2017 when Invest St. Lucia and Government Officials will brief members of the communities in the South on the 2.6 billion US dollar DSH project. The Chamber is coordinating the event.

Going forward our local producers of goods and services must try to look at the global picture, and exports to sub regional, regional and global markets will become part of their overall strategy.

Apart from the government seeking opportunities to fulfil campaign promises, the entertainment scene is also very high on the agenda; the calypso season is gearing up, Roots and Soul Festival is very much talked about and Miss Universe Contest is also making the rounds. ## SAINT LUCIA POISED FOR US BILLION DOLLAR INVESTMENT COMMITMENT IN 2017!!!!

The inclement weather in the past 24 hours sought to remind us that we are in the Hurricane Season, and it signaled that proper preparation is necessary. In the Caribbean, we take the position – Don't Worry, Be Happy! We ignore warnings and go merrily about our business. However, with the weather pattern being as unreliable as it is due to Climate Change, we must change our approach to responding to warnings.

In spite of the weather, the meeting which was organized by the St. Lucia Chamber of Commerce, Industry and Agriculture at The NSDC complex in Vieux Fort was held on Wednesday, 14<sup>th</sup> June, 2017. This meeting was scheduled to facilitate business persons in Vieux Fort and environs, the opportunity to meet with the Chairman and CEO of the Citizenship by Investment Programme (CIP) and learn at firsthand about the operations of the CIP.

The small gathering got immersed into the discussion and at the conclusion everyone was very satisfied with the information shared. The CIP team sought to share the progress of this important organization with emphasis on transparency.

The programme is in its second year and the year 2017 after the amendments to the legislation which removed the requirement for applicants to have assets of three million dollars to a simple donation of US\$100,000.00 which is being the most popular with persons seeking our Saint Lucian passport. Apart from the Donation category, there are three other categories – Real Estate, Enterprise Projects and Government Bonds. To date only two of the four categories are fully operational, namely: Donation and Government Bonds, yielding eighty-three and five applications respectively.

To date there are thirteen Authorized Local Agents who receive a ten percent commission for each successful applicant. Eighty-eight applications have been submitted, with 4 rejections and two were reversed. The Minister responsible for the CIP is the Prime Minister who has authority to reverse a decision in case of appeal by an applicant. In the interest of transparency, a Board of Appeal will shortly be established. With respect to Due Diligence, there are 4 levels which involve in house, private investigation, Interpol and final clearing bank. The average time to process an application is 71 days.

Dominica is the lead destination in the region at the moment and St. Lucia is very much in the game. There has to be continuous updating of the programme and it was refreshing to learn that the Governments of the region will be getting together to arrive at common positions to deal with this very important foreign exchange revenue earning programme. I invite my readers in the Caribbean Diaspora to engage the CIP executives in finding opportunities to invest and receive assistance in realizing your project. Check out the CIP website and make your move. Put your project on the table. Visit www.cipsaintlucia.com

The final item on the agenda was DSH. The Desert Star Holdings Limited, the company that is promoting of the Pearl of the Caribbean project remains in the front of the debate when it comes to investments in St. Lucia. We cannot deny the fact that there is no shortage of projects in St. Lucia. My own position is that investments in the pipeline will exceed a 1Billion US dollars by the end of 2017.

#### WINNING STRATEGIES

For Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises by Edward A. Harris A Review by Modeste Downes

Although Edward Harris has no scruples about revealing his age—which for purposes of this review is of little consequence—the contents of this specialized volume (94 pages) has achieved a lot more than to convince this writer that the author is suitably qualified to write on the subject and to urge his readers to accept the advice he so magnanimously shares to all and sundry. To remove any doubt as to the strength of this statement, one simply has to browse the man's data provided toward the latter part of the book (Ch. 18).

Although he has written extensively in the local press over a long period, how many know, for example, Edward Harris has provided consultancy service to the garment industry, on assignment, to Saint Lucia, Jamaica, Guyana and as far afield as Sierra Leone, West Africa? (pp. 82-85) Besides the country of his birth, Guyana, Ed has lived and worked in Barbados, Dominica, Grenada, Jamaica, Sierra Leone, Tanzania and, of course Saint Lucia, his adopted home for more than three decades. On the basis of such information, I am prepared to say upfront that I endorse unreservedly Harris' claim, at pg. 80, "I feel eminently qualified to use the designation QBE", to say, he is qualified by experience. Which is not to say the writer is not otherwise schooled and educated.

Winning Strategies is a one-stop shop to understanding, setting up and developing a business, and to do the right things and develop the right attitudes to make a success out of it. 'Dedicated to students, employees, and business practitioners', the book seeks to guide and influence those learning about business and trade in a formal setting, enthusiasts desirous of venturing into business, as much as it offers advice to the established entrepreneur who may be in need of a paradigm shift.

Set out in short chapters and written in clear, easy-to-digest English, Winning Strategies maps strategies and techniques, from the birth of the idea, to determining what type of business/structure—sole proprietorship, joint venture or partnership, etc.—to preparing a business plan, where to locate, securing finance, to staffing, marketing, etc.

Finance being a major ingredient for initiating a business venture, the writer, no doubt based on his own experience and observation and knowledge of the sector, urges business enthusiasts to seek and secure all the advice they can get from professionals before approaching a bank or other prospective financier, if that is a necessary step to move forward. This is in tune with a statement I heard recently on the evening news, by a trainer at a small business workshop: "Small business persons (often) have difficulty accessing finance because they do not meet the standard requirements..."

Curiously, the author does not limit his advice to physical or financial or infrastructural wherewithal for establishing a business or service, or for the marketing of a product. For instance, there is the issue of 'the mindset'—"which is based upon information and education about the implications of business and a passion to succeed." Emphasizing the need for discipline, passion to succeed, the writer speaks of 'ethical greed'—the desire to achieve more without offending others (which I suspect refers to customers as well as one's competitors). (Ch. 2)

Chapter 13 offers a wide range of useful tips for success (pp.64-66) followed by The 4 P's of Marketing (Ch. 14): Product, Place, Price, Promotion, all essential ingredients to success in business.

Additionally, Winning Strategies, instructively, speaks to a whole lot more than the attainment of personal goals and success in business. The book offers sound advice for life. For instance, the exhortation to approach life with the right attitude or mindset, translates to "Be right with your mind and you will be right with the world." (pg. 13) Harris stresses further, that it should never be about business for self, the bottom line. Social responsibility, consideration for the needs of the community where the business or the entrepreneur operates, is part of the ethics of business, thus we often hear the expression 'giving back' when the business community makes donations, etc.

The twenty-two chapters that constitute Winning Strategies for Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises, is an ample manual for whoever is interested in acquiring an understanding of the sector, the rudiments of business or entrepreneurship, or is keen to reshape their already established business for profitability and a more fulfilling experience.

Edward Harris is a deeply religious person. His writing and the advice he offers is strictly professional. Yet he manages to squeeze in a line on faith, as he ends a section and extols the virtues of Multi-Level Marketing (MLM): "Remember always to keep the faith, God is in charge, dream big and expect daily miracles!" (Ch. 15)

Understanding the role of information technology (IT), the Internet and social media in the environment in which businesses thrive, flounder or crash depending on whether or not the free and timely access to information is used as an effective tool, Harris provides an entire section, (Ch. 20) with links to relevant websites.

With Harris' credentials and wide ranging experience (QBE) in Business and PR Consulting, Real Estate, Networking, Freelance Journalism, Motivational Speaking and Private Sector Advocacy (pg. 81), I stake my own integrity on the assurance that the advice contained in Winning Strategies is authoritative and will serve the author's intended target most beneficially.
